

Property Crimes 2024

Warren County

Focus is on a subset of those crimes where offenders take possession of another person's property by unlawful means. These include Burglary, Larceny/Theft, Fraud and Motor Vehicle Theft. Note that Robbery is covered under the Violent Crime theme.



BURGLARY

The unlawful entry into a building or some other structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Crimes: 35 Clearance Rate: 45.71%

Note that a single crime may consist of multiple offenses.

A crime is cleared in one of two ways: when at least one offender is arrested, or by exceptional means when situations beyond law enforcement's control prevent the agency from arresting the offender - i.e.,

a) Death of Offender

b) Prosecution Declined (by the prosecutor for other than lack of probable cause)

c) In Custody of Other Jurisdiction (includes extradition denied)

d) Victim Refused to Cooperate (in the prosecution)

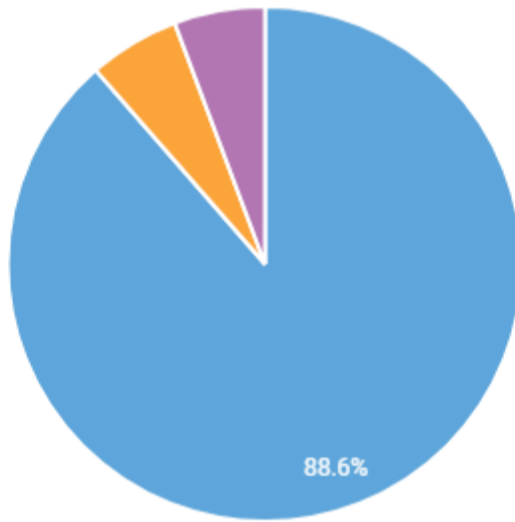

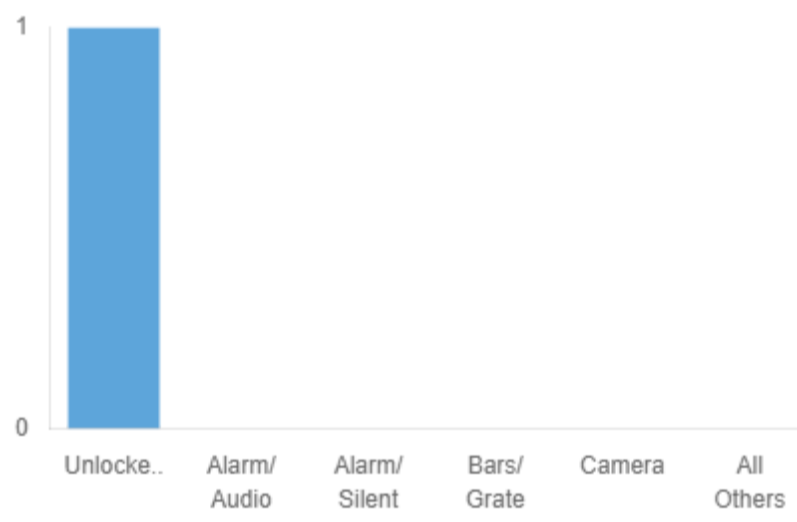

Burglary Crimes

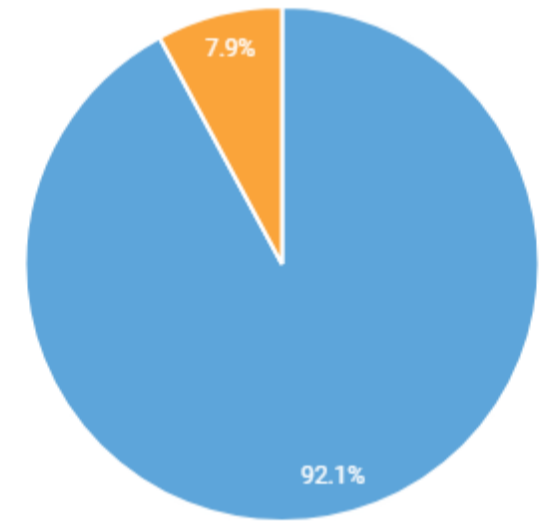

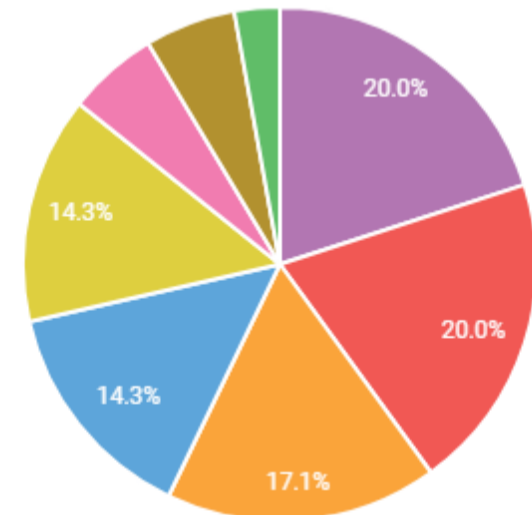

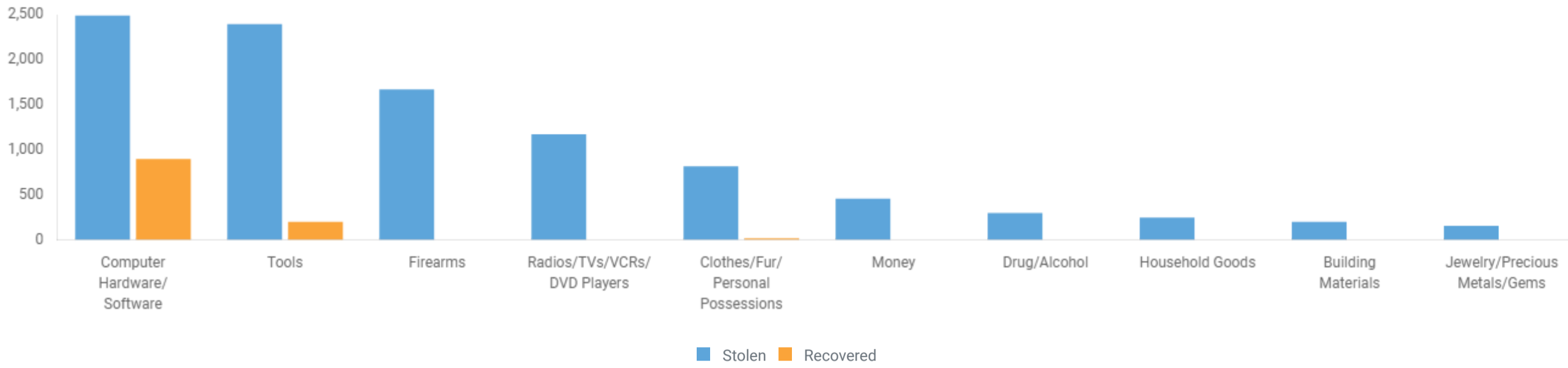

LARCENY (THEFT)

The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession, or constructive possession, of another person.

Crimes: 372 Clearance Rate: 47.58%

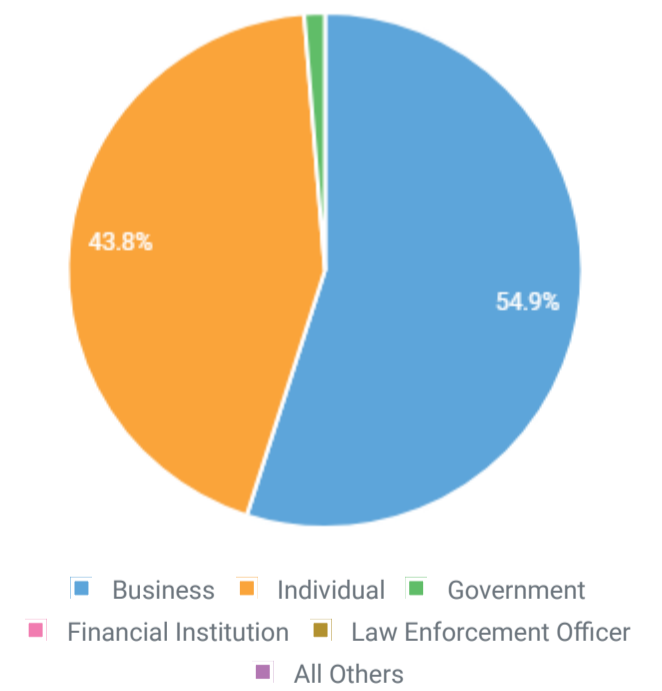

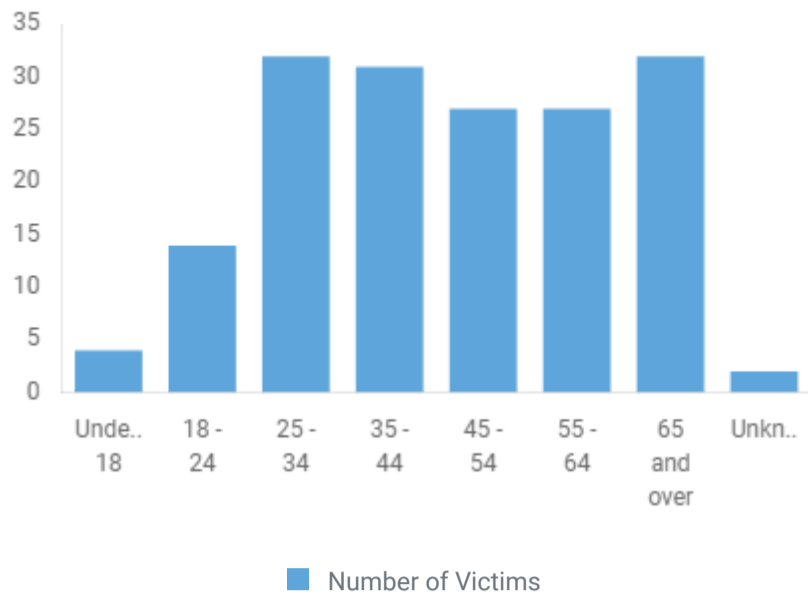
VICTIM TYPE

Larceny Victims



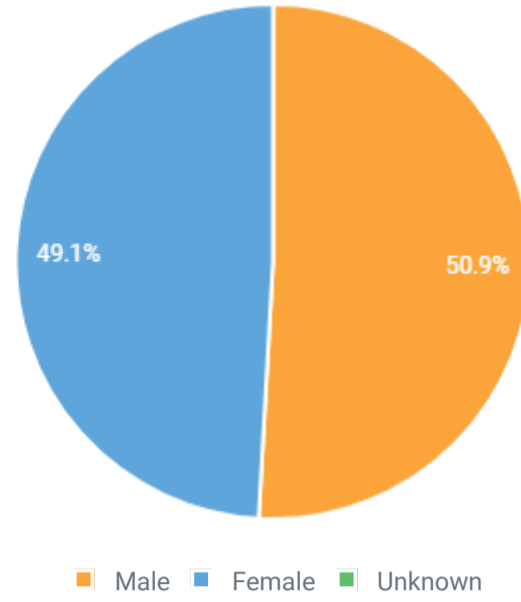
VICTIM AGE

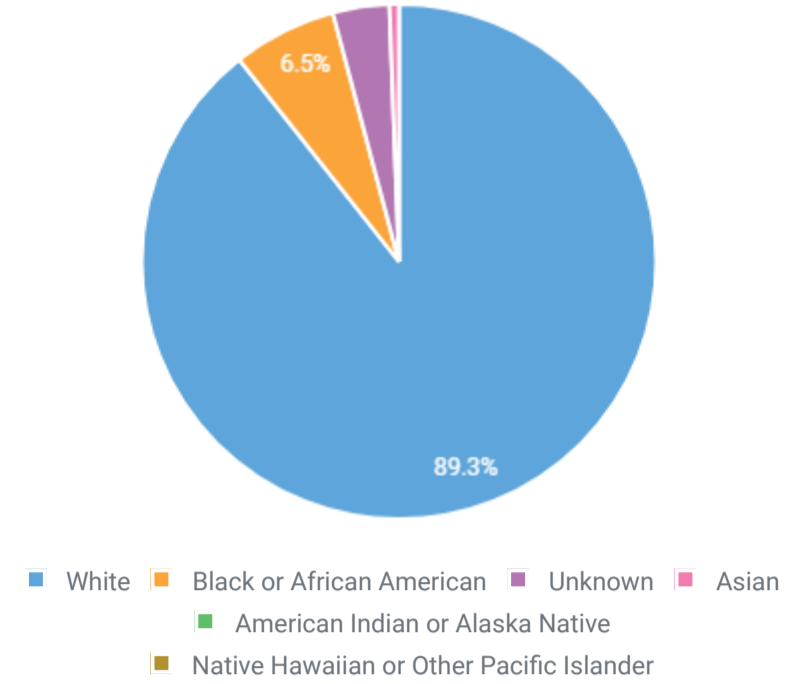

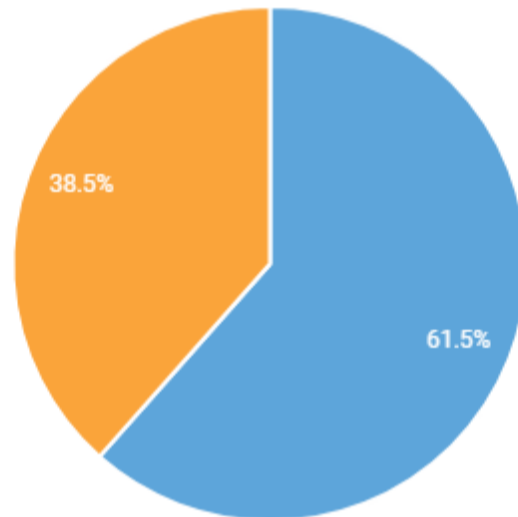

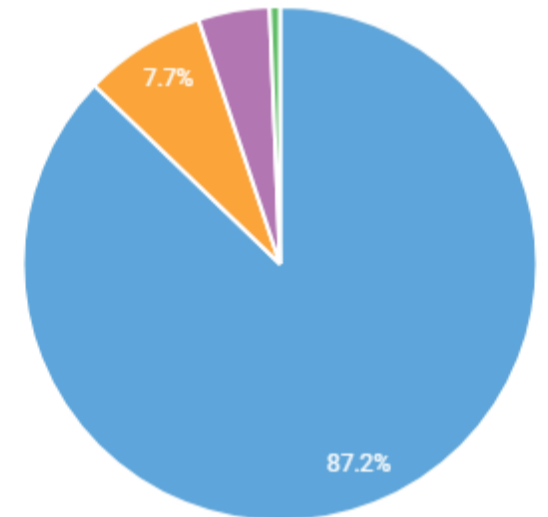

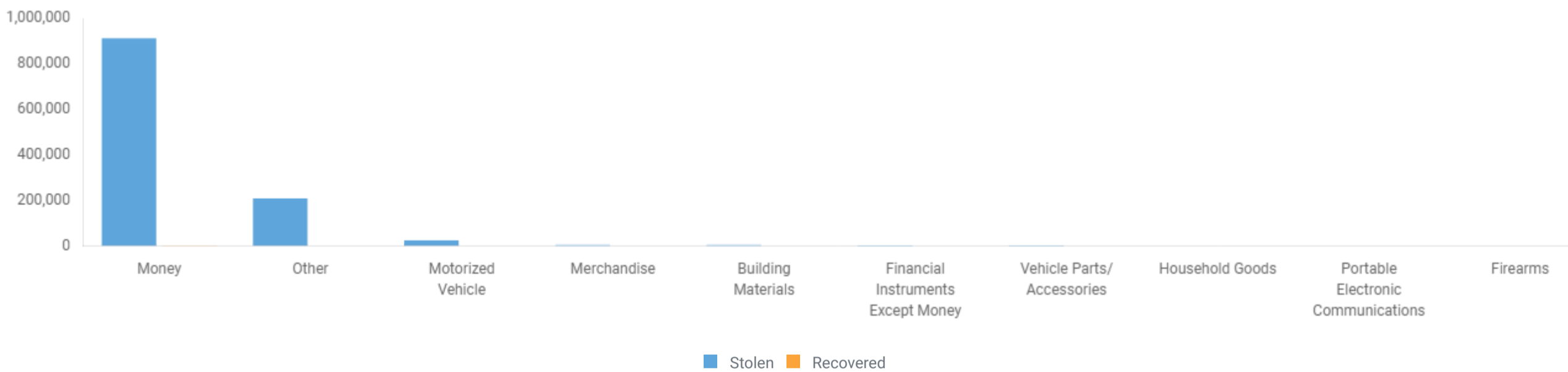

The theft of a motorized vehicle. Vehicles may have been stolen under other offenses such as Robbery (Carjacking) and are not included in this crime count.

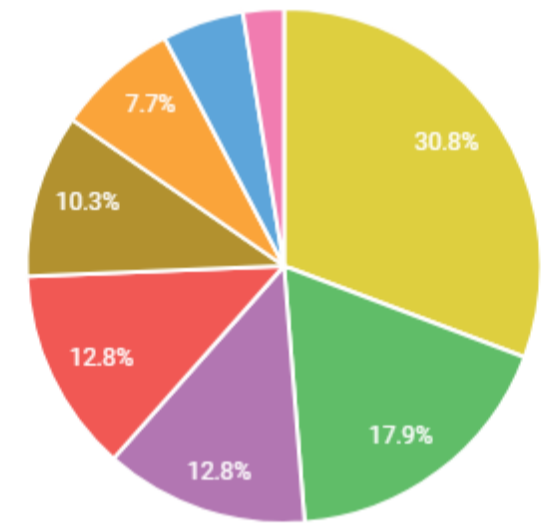

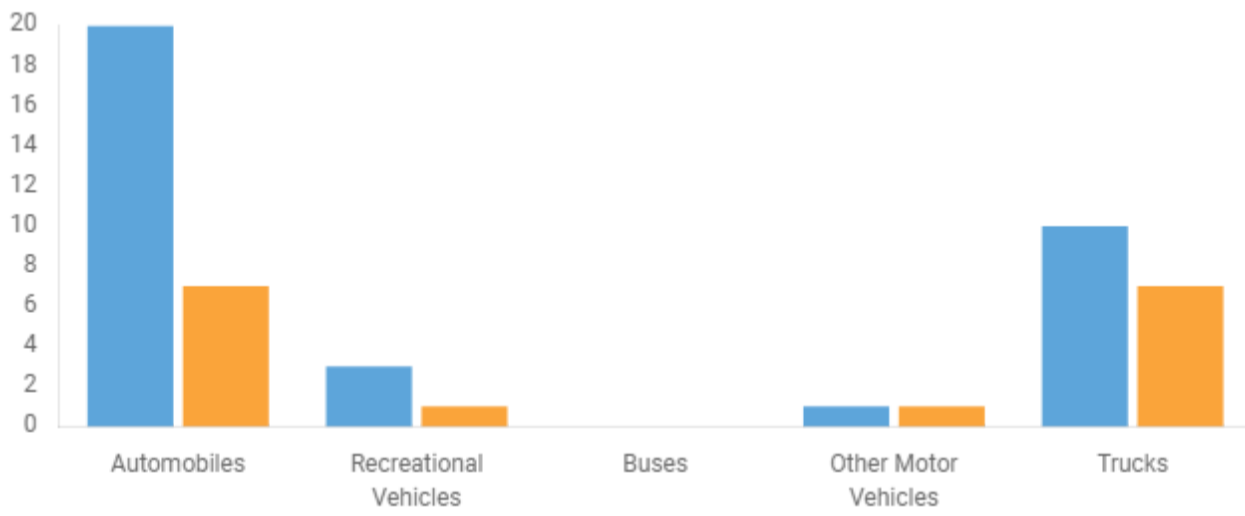

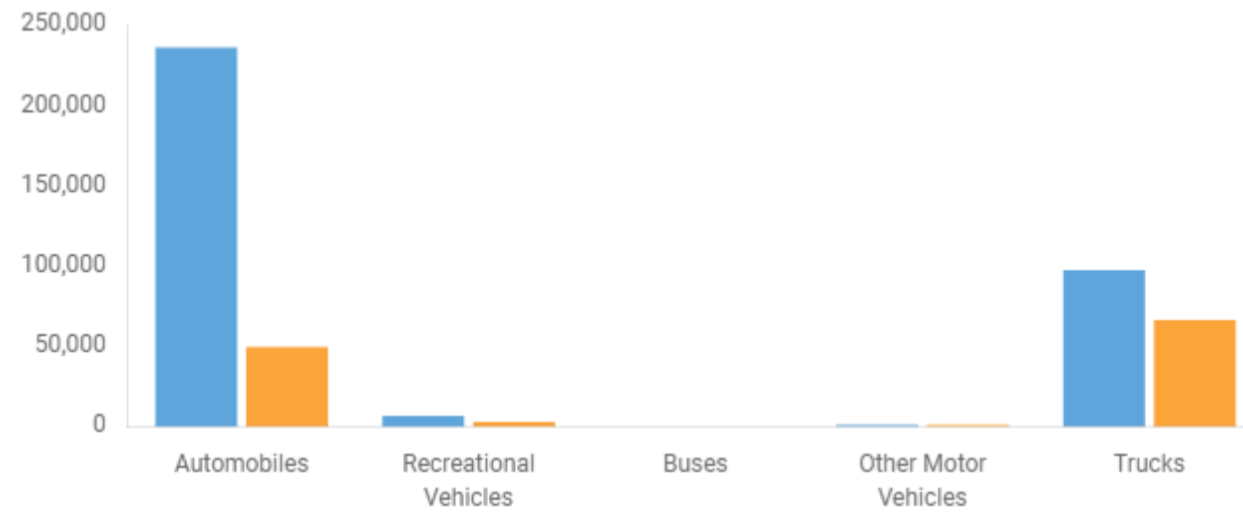
