DRUG OFFENSES

The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use. This comprises Drug/Narcotics Violations, relating to controlled drug or narcotics and Drug Equipment Violations, relating to equipment or devices utilized in preparing and/or using these substances.

Crimes: 288 **Arrests:** 223 **Clearance Rate:** 79.86%

Note that a single crime may consist of multiple offenses.

The number of arrests represents drug offense arrests that clear any crime, regardless of what crime was reported in the incident.

A crime is cleared in one of two ways: when at least one offender is arrested, or by exceptional means when situations beyond law enforcement's control prevent the agency from arresting the offender - i.e.,

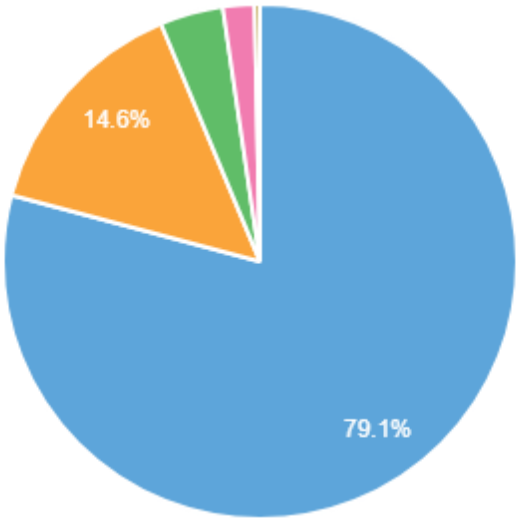
- a) Death of Offender
- b) Prosecution Declined (by the prosecutor for other than lack of probable cause)
- c) In Custody of Other Jurisdiction (includes extradition denied)
- d) Victim Refused to Cooperate (in the prosecution)
- e) Juvenile/No Custody (the handling of a juvenile without taking him/her into custody, but rather by oral or written notice given to the parents or legal guardian in a case involving a minor offense, such as petty larceny).

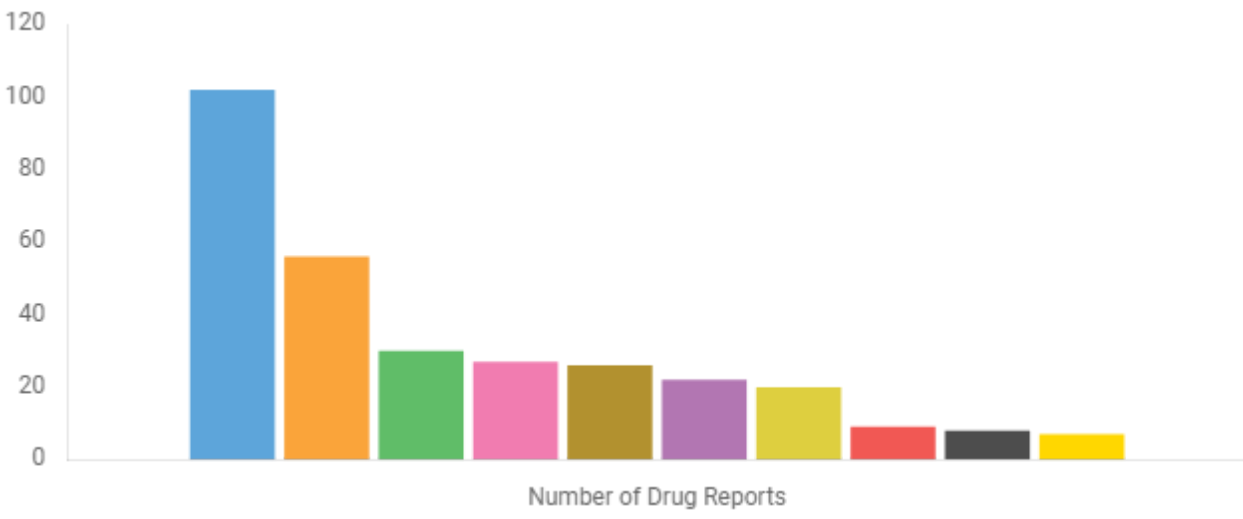

Number of Drug Reports

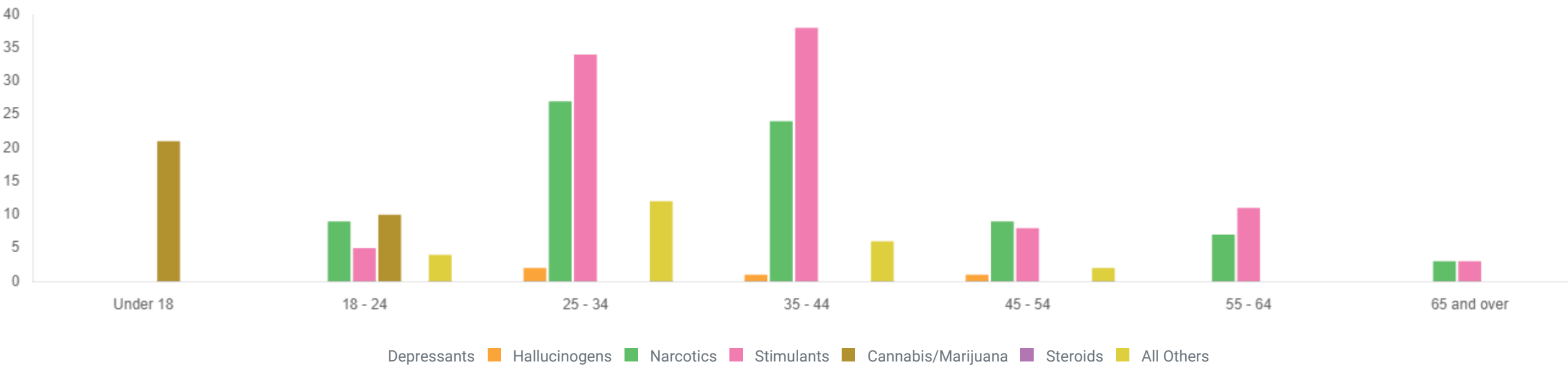

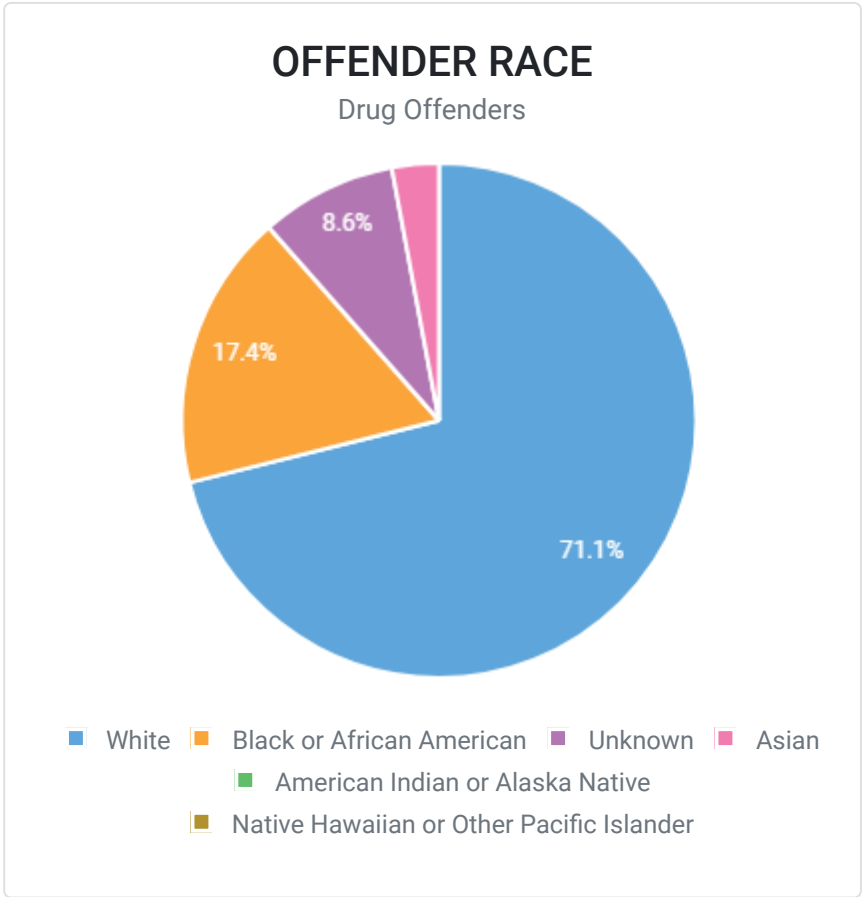
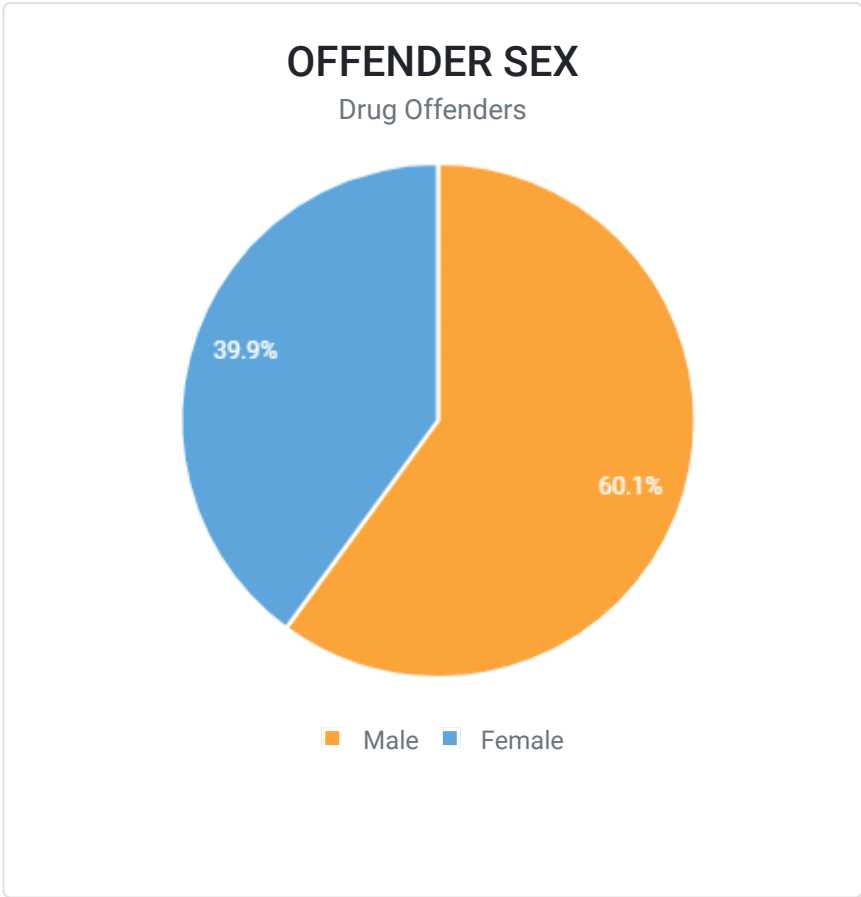
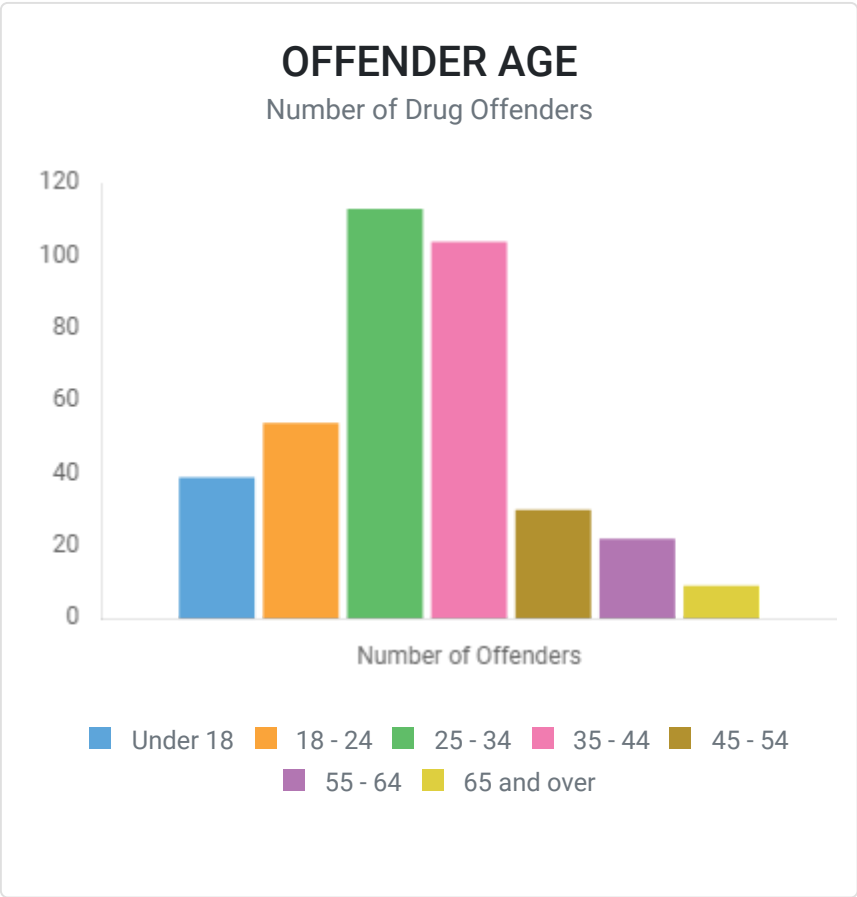
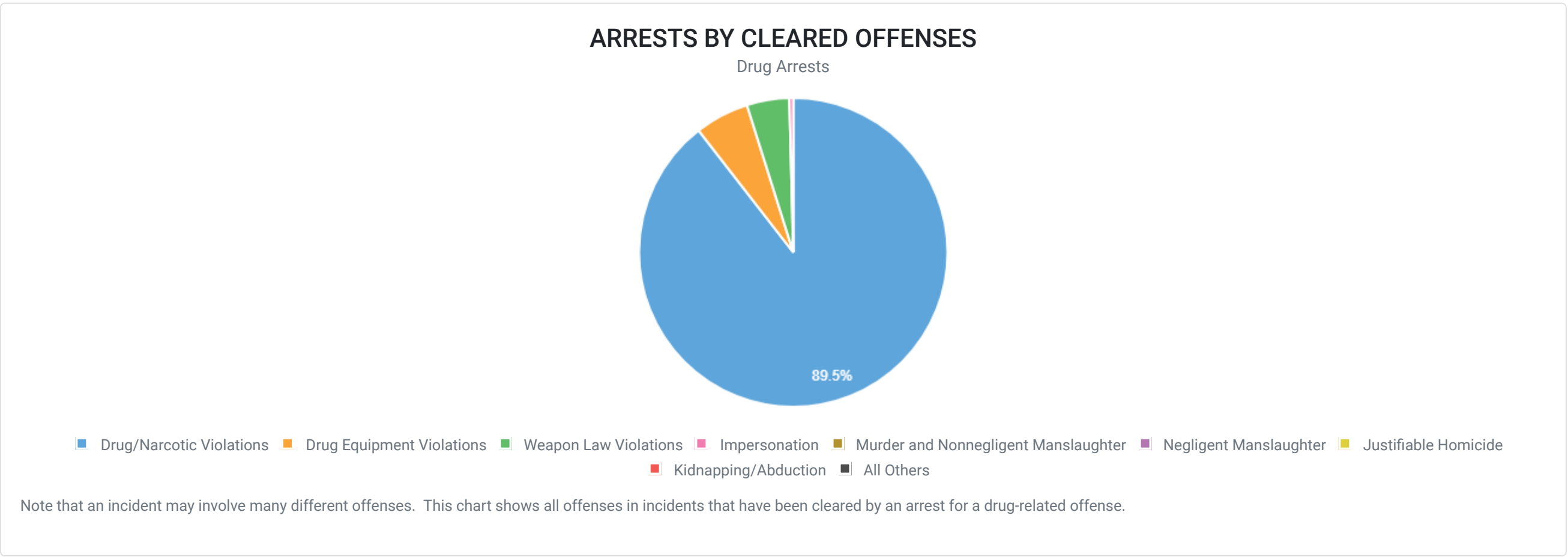
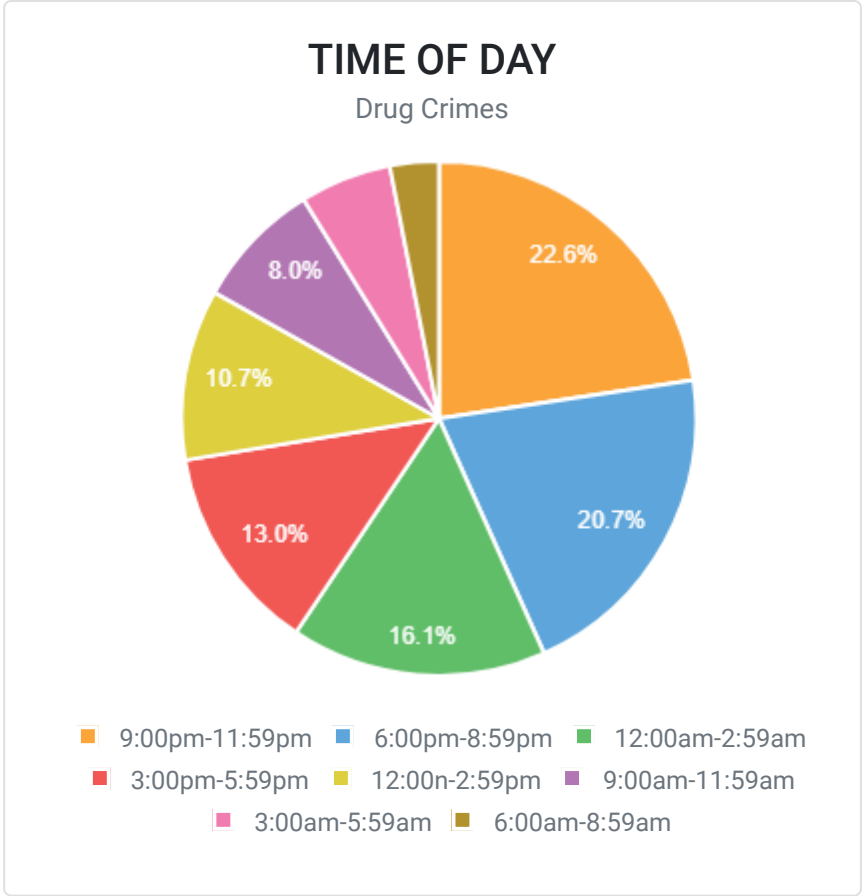
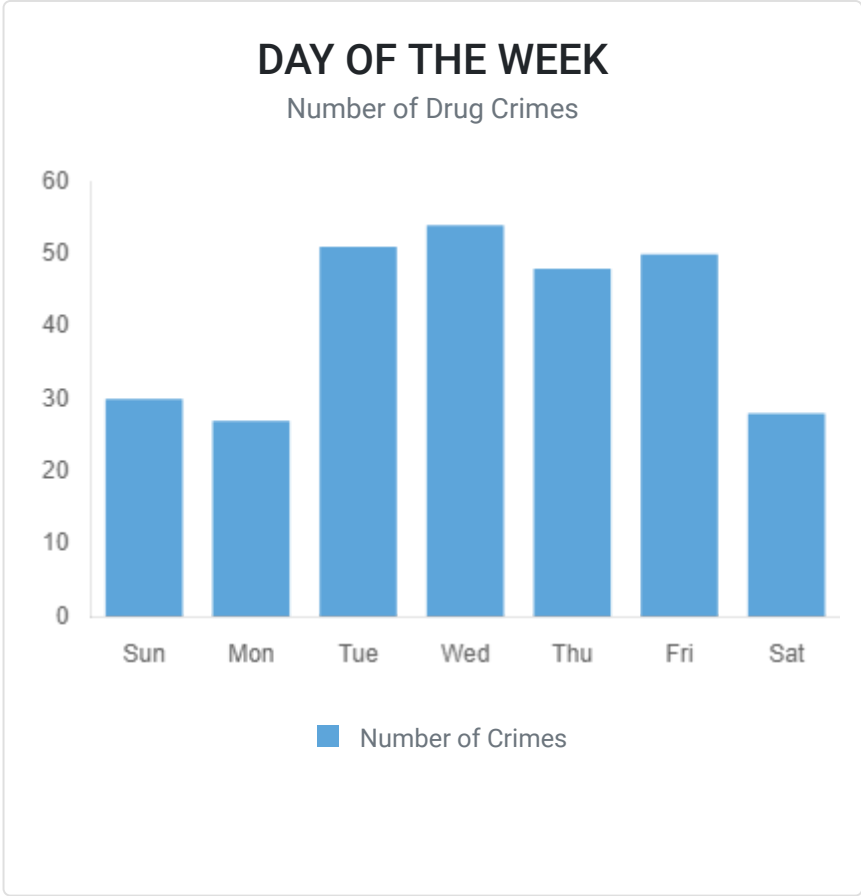
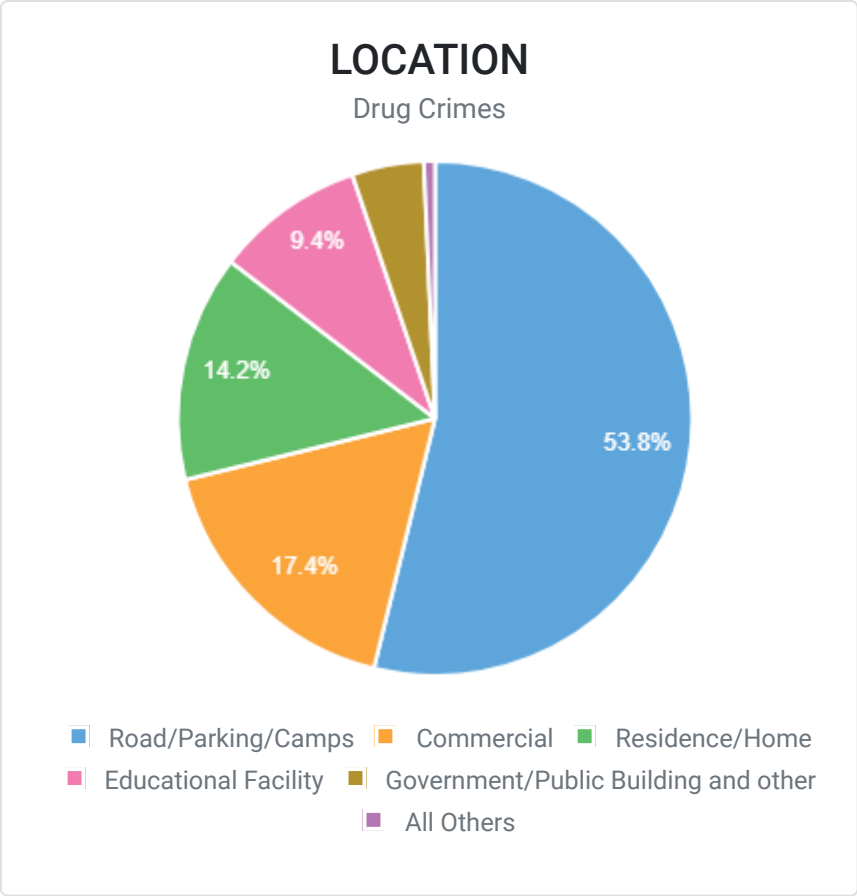
SEIZED DRUG TYPES BY AGE GROUP

WEAPON LAW VIOLATIONS

The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons.

Crimes: 56 Arrests: 21 Clearance Rate: 76.79%

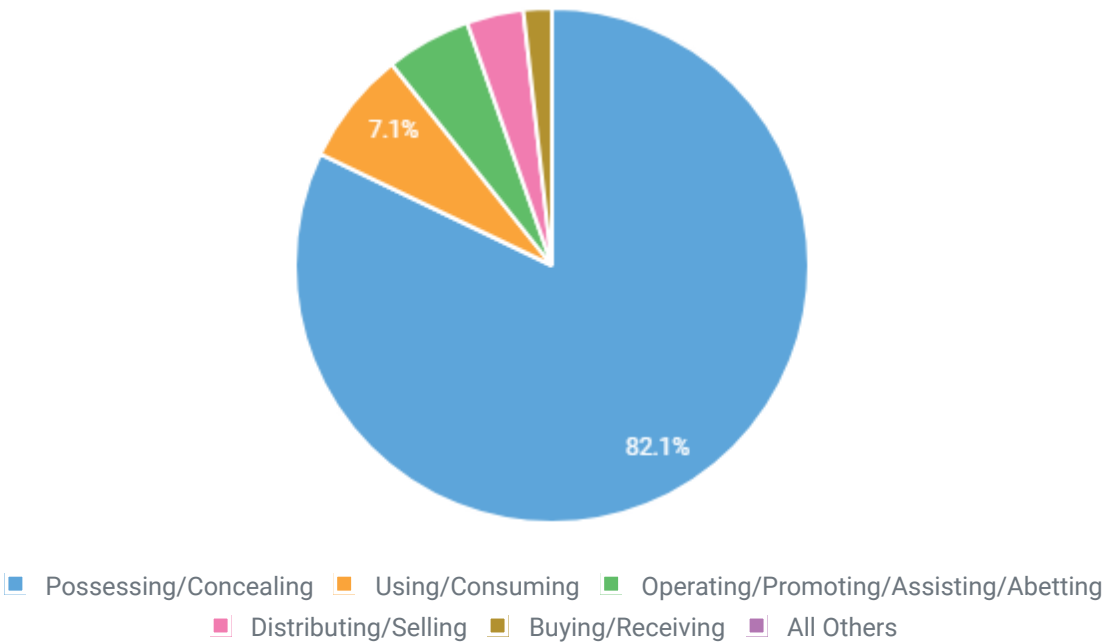

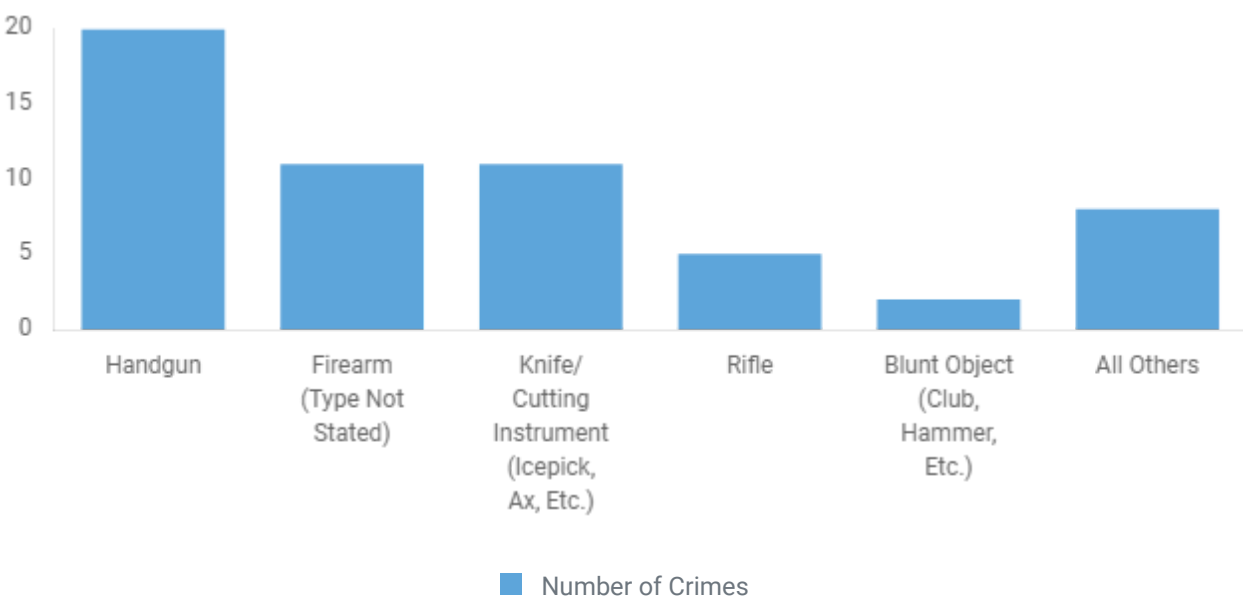
Weapon Law Violation Crimes

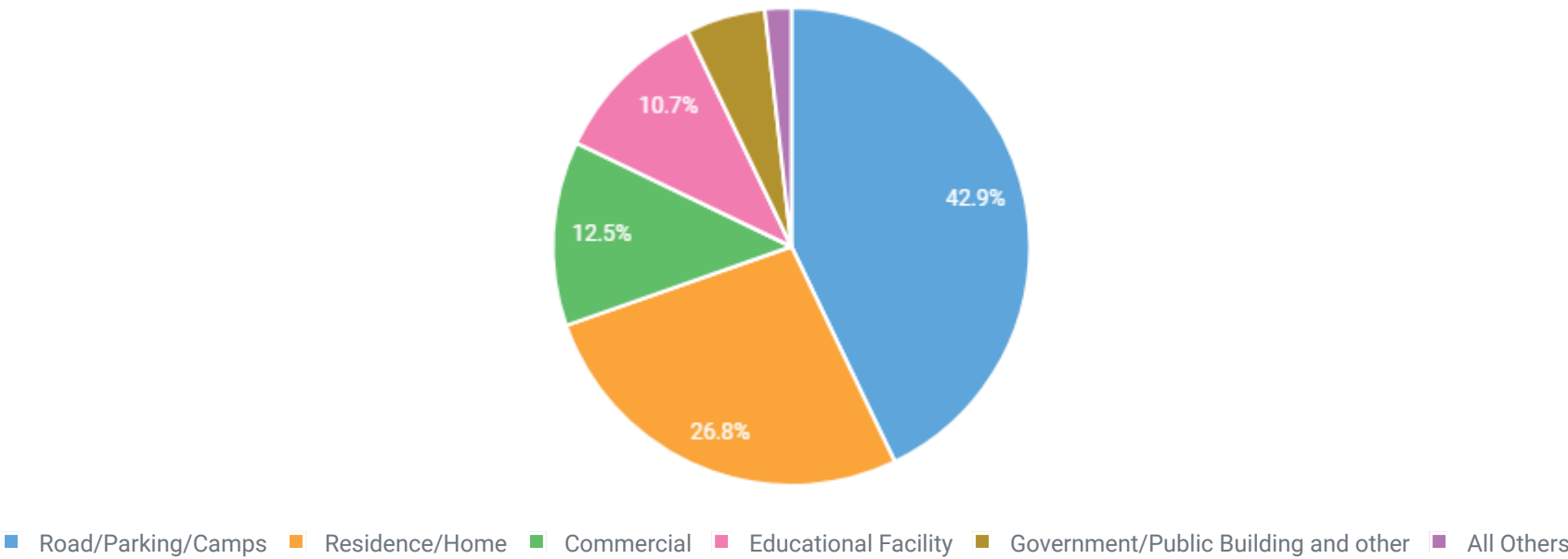

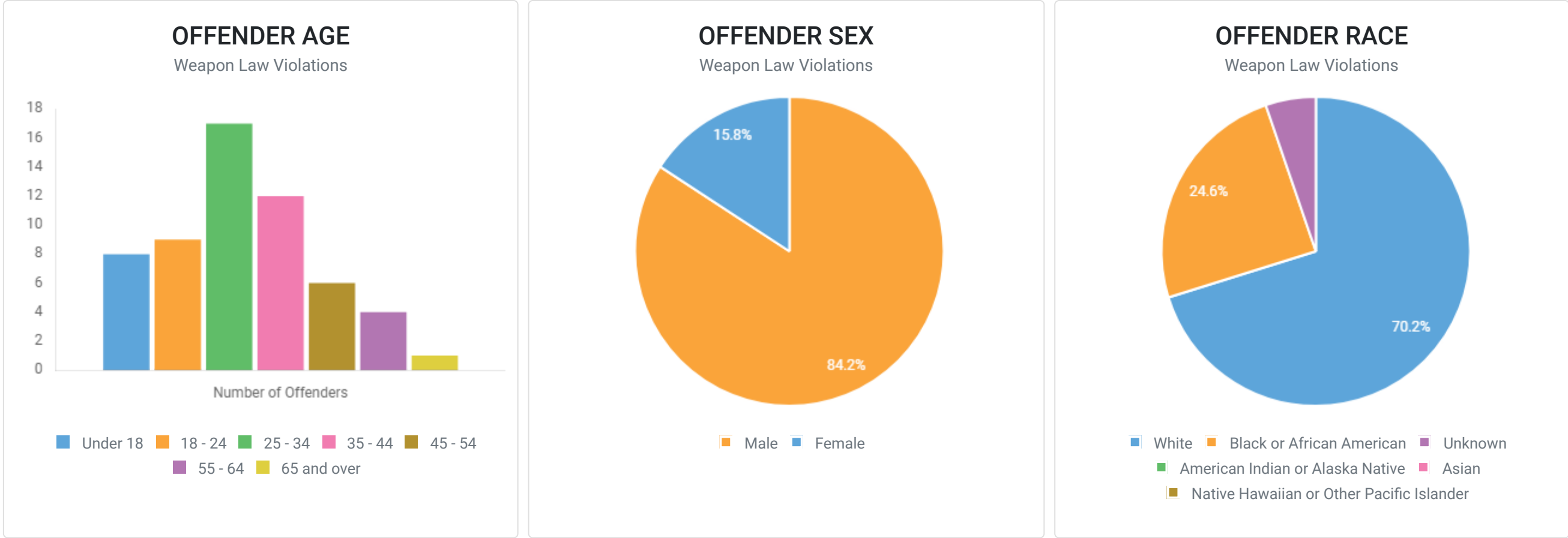
Number of Weapon Law Violation Crimes

Crimes: 42 **Arrests:** 9 **Clearance Rate:** 30.95%

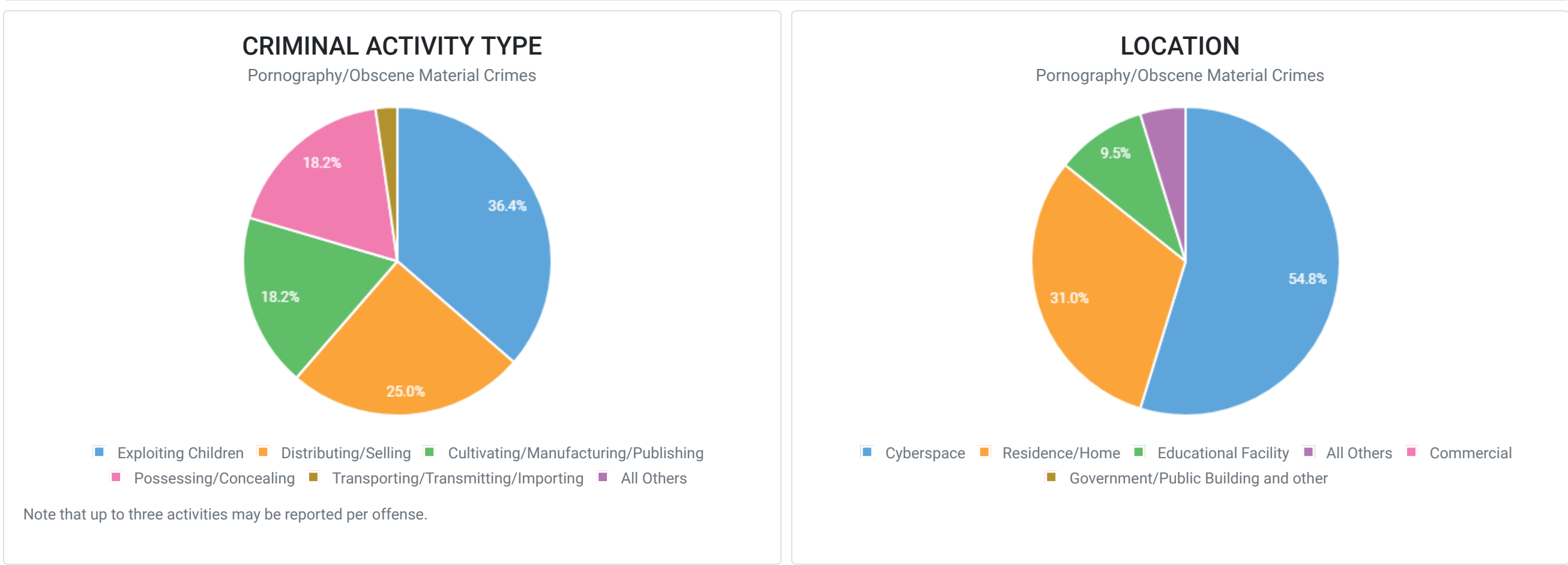
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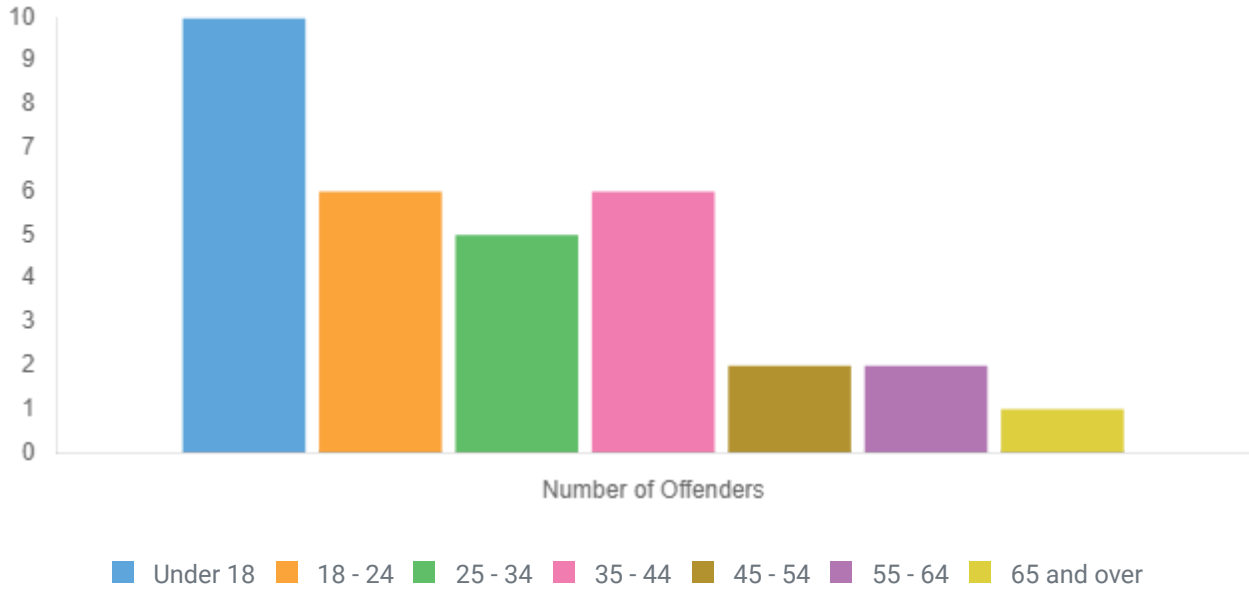

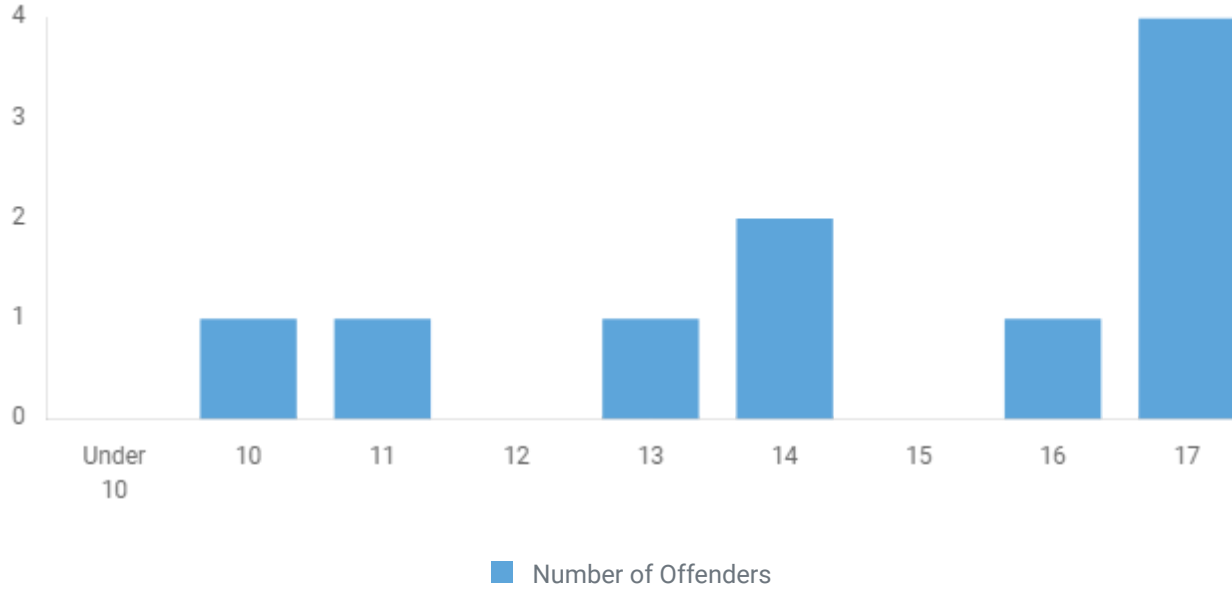
OFFENDER AGE

Pornography/Obscene Material



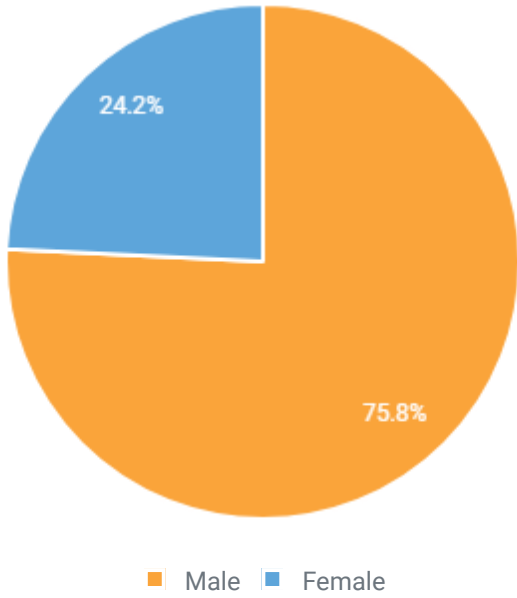
JUVENILE OFFENDER AGE

Pornography/Obscene Material



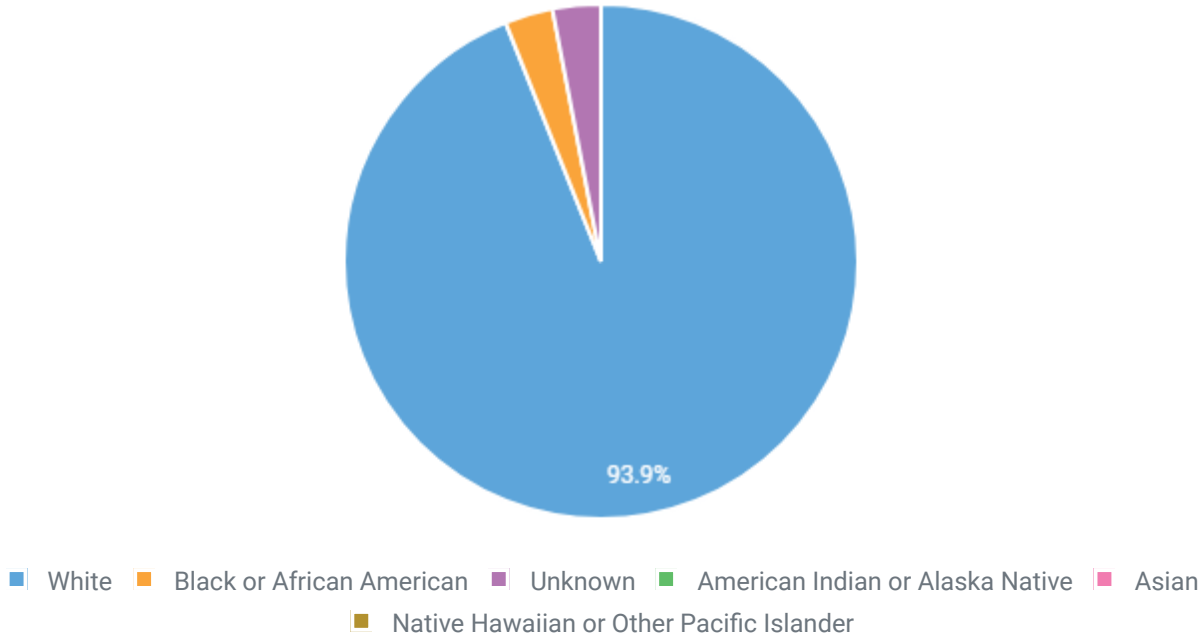
OFFENDER SEX

ANIMAL CRUELTY

Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly taking an action that mistreats or kills any animal without just cause, such as torturing, tormenting, mutilation, maiming, poisoning, or abandonment. Included are instances of duty to provide care, e.g., shelter, food, water, care if sick or injured; transporting or confining an animal in a manner likely to cause injury or death; causing an animal to fight with another; inflicting excessive or repeated unnecessary pain or suffering, e.g., uses objects to beat or torture an animal. This definition does not include proper maintenance of animals for show or sport; use of animals for food, lawful hunting, fishing, or trapping.

Crimes: 5 **Arrests:** 1 **Clearance Rate:** 40%

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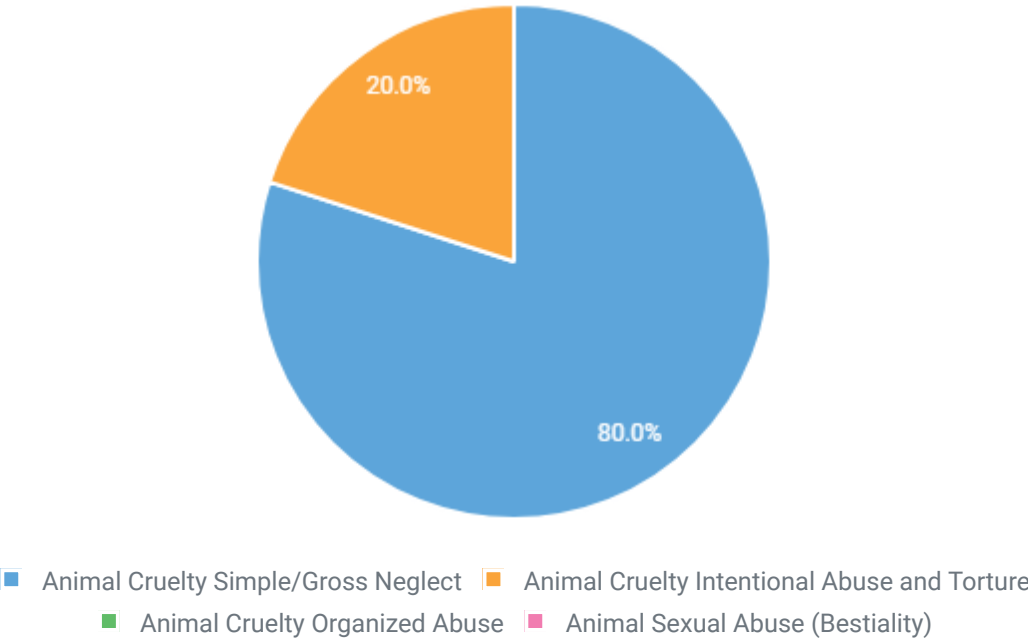

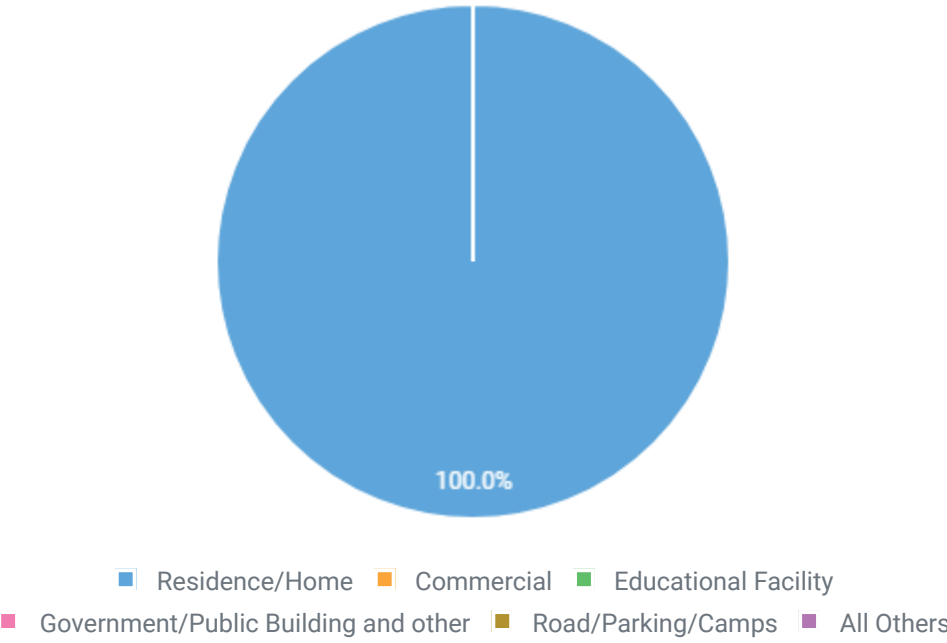
Animal Cruelty Crimes

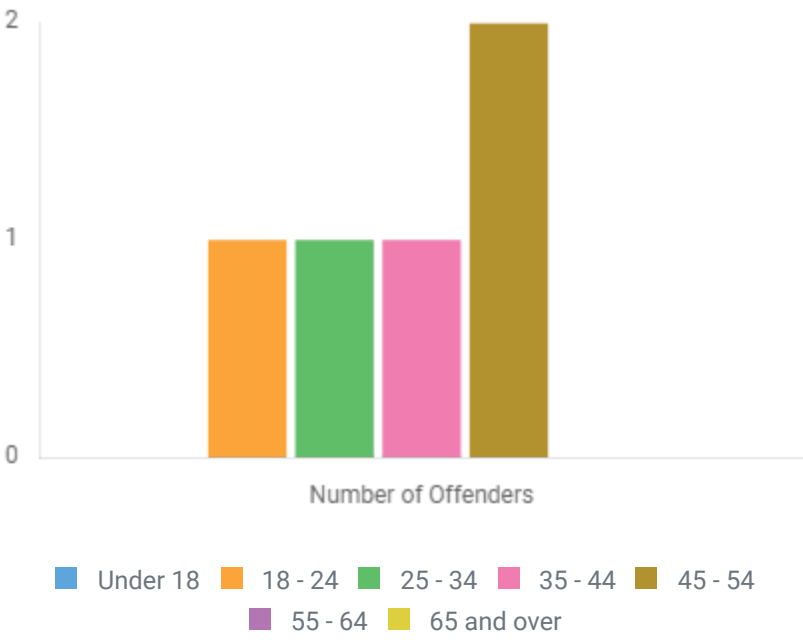

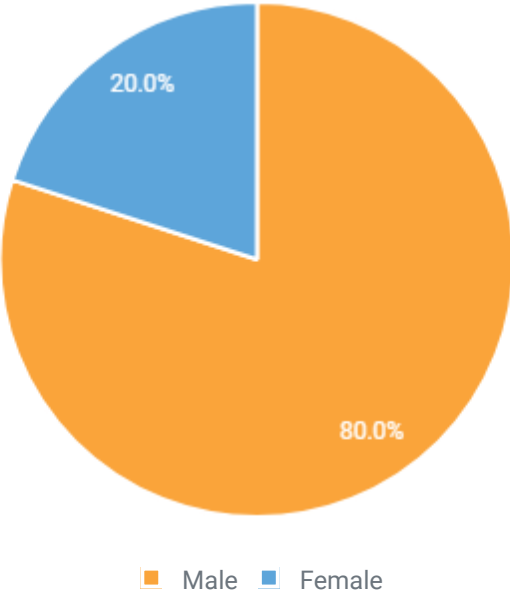
