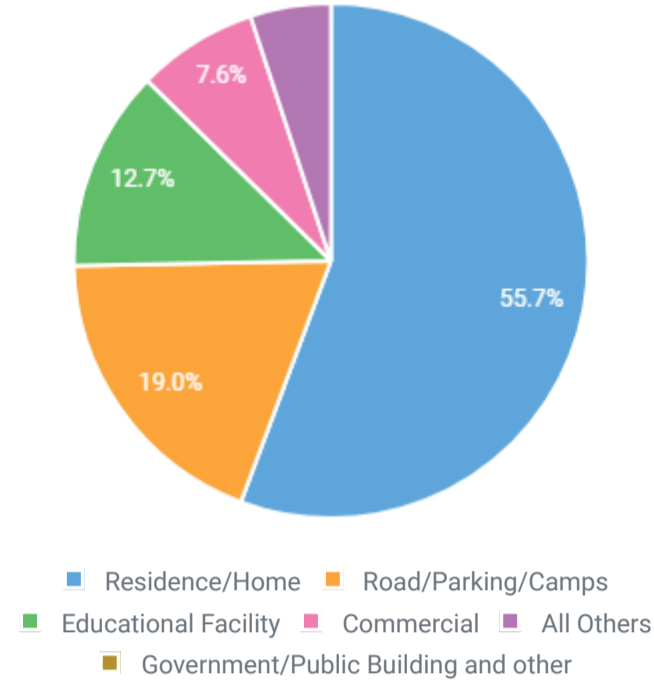

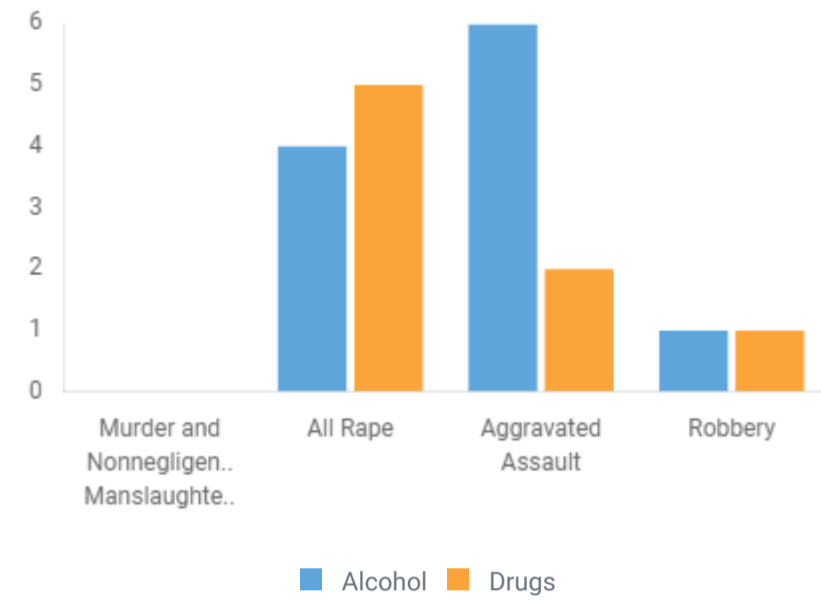

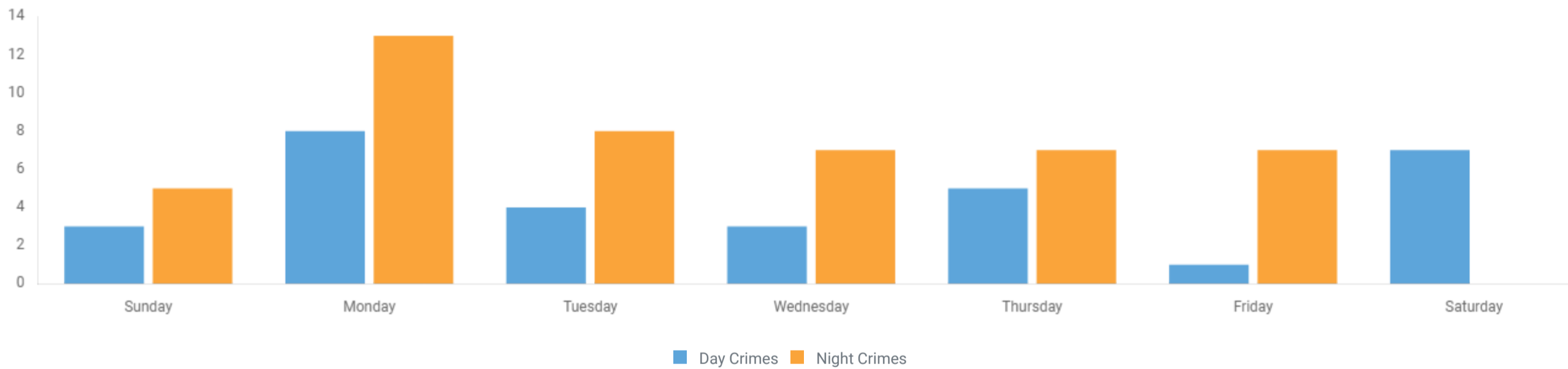

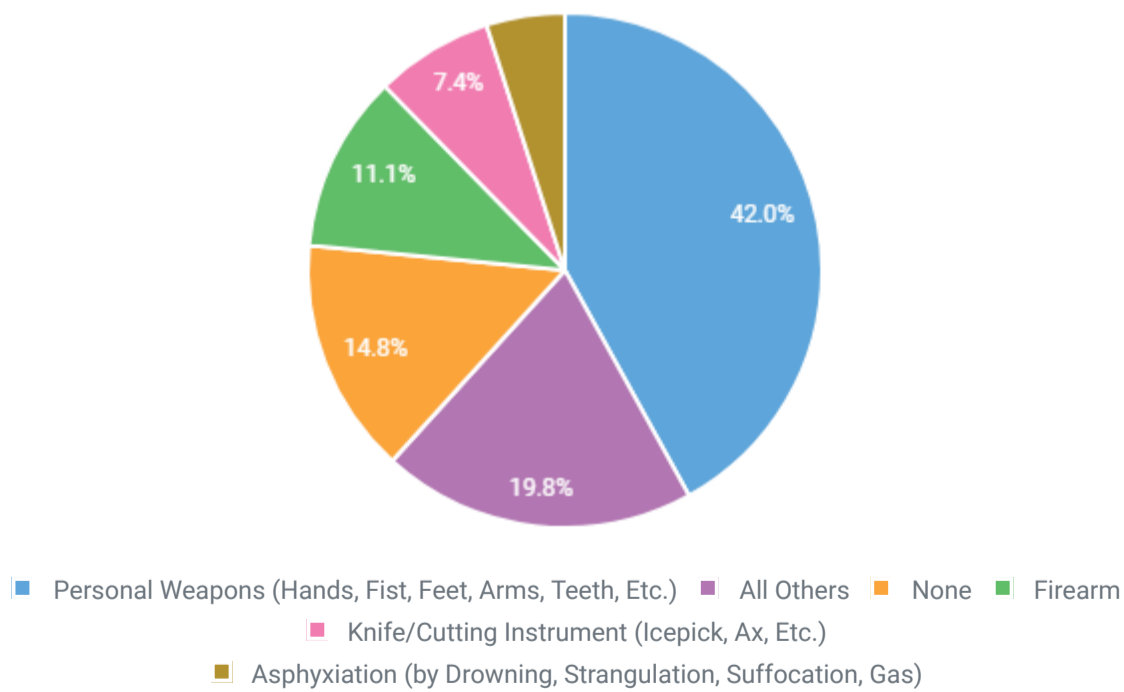
NUMBER OF CRIMES BY DAY OF WEEK AND KNOWN TIME

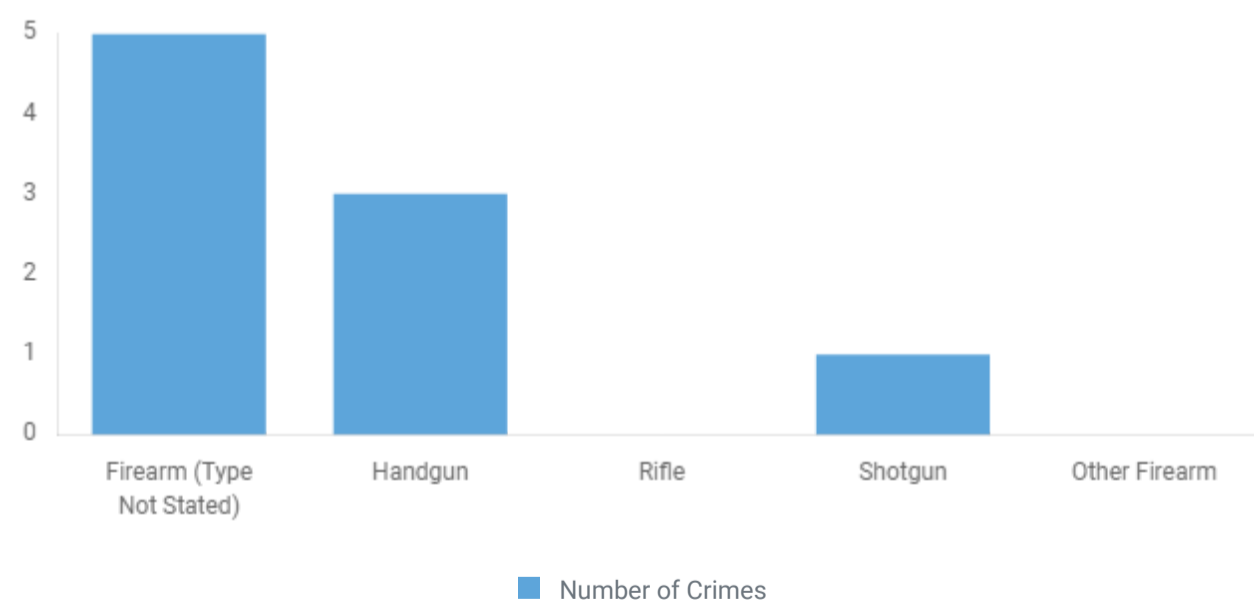

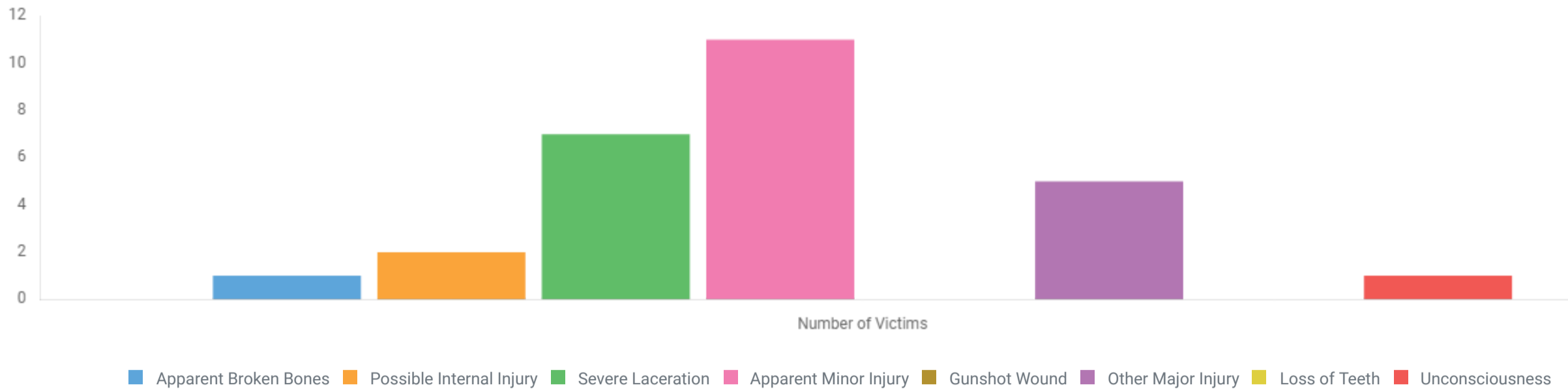

The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Crimes: 1 Clearance Rate: 100%

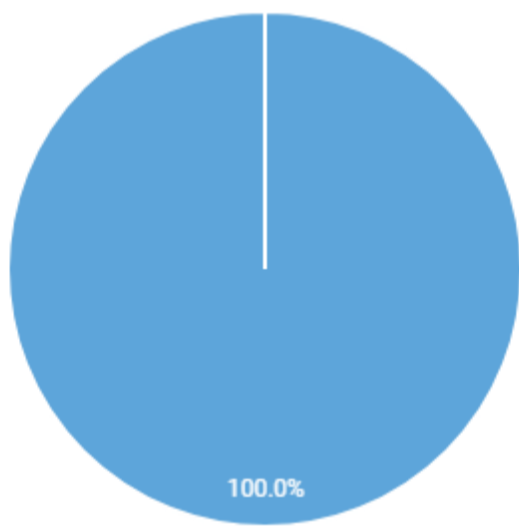

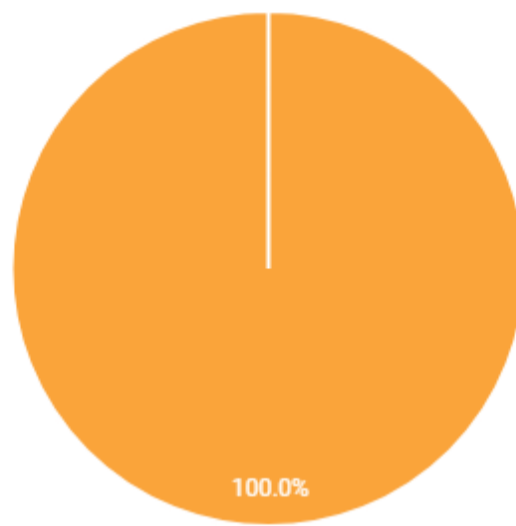
NUMBER OF CRIMES BY DAY OF WEEK AND KNOWN TIME

RAPE

The penetration, no matter how slight, of the vagina or anus with any body part or object, or oral penetration by a sex organ of another person, or by a sex related object. This definition also includes instances in which the victim is incapable of giving consent because of temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (including due to the influence of drugs or alcohol) or because of age. Physical resistance is not required on the part of the victim to demonstrate lack of consent.

Rape includes Forcible Rape, Forcible Sodomy, & Sexual Assault with an Object.

Crimes: 43 Clearance Rate: 41.86%

A crime is cleared in one of two ways: when at least one offender is arrested, or by exceptional means when situations beyond law enforcement's control prevent the agency from arresting the offender - i.e.,

- a) Death of Offender

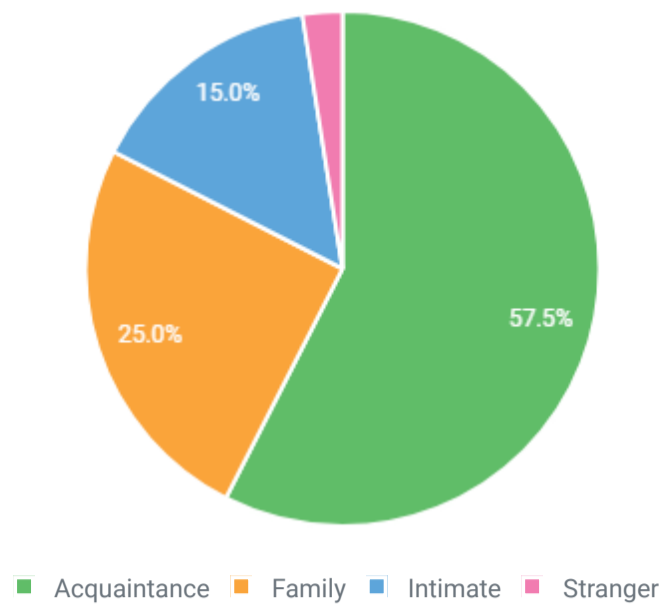
NUMBER OF CRIMES BY DAY OF WEEK AND KNOWN TIME

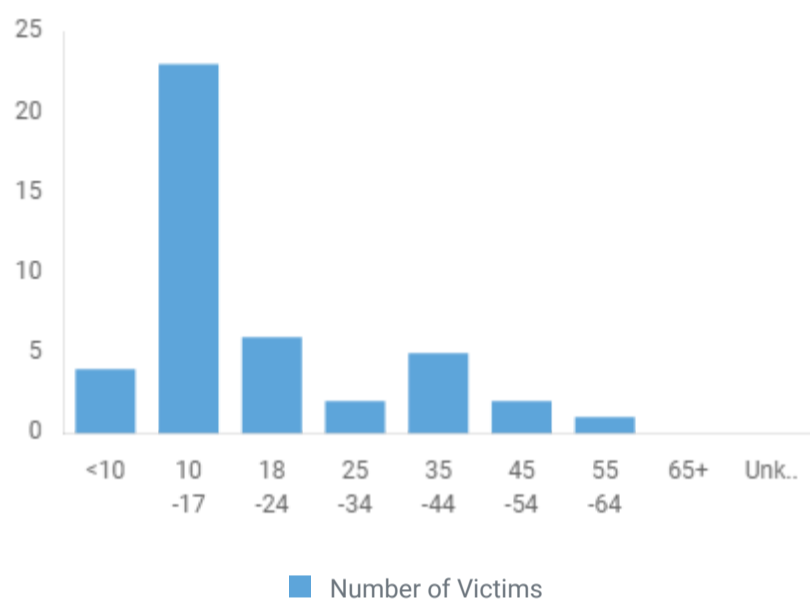

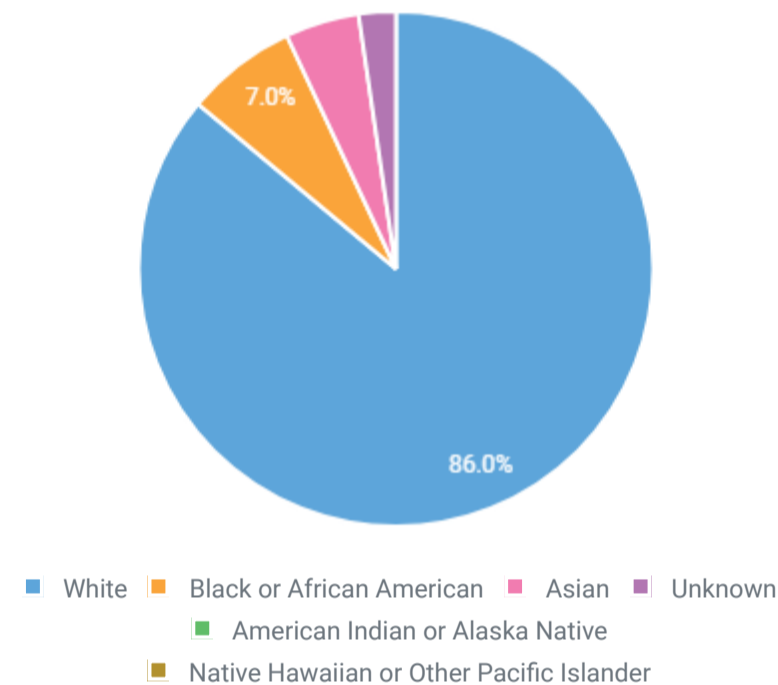

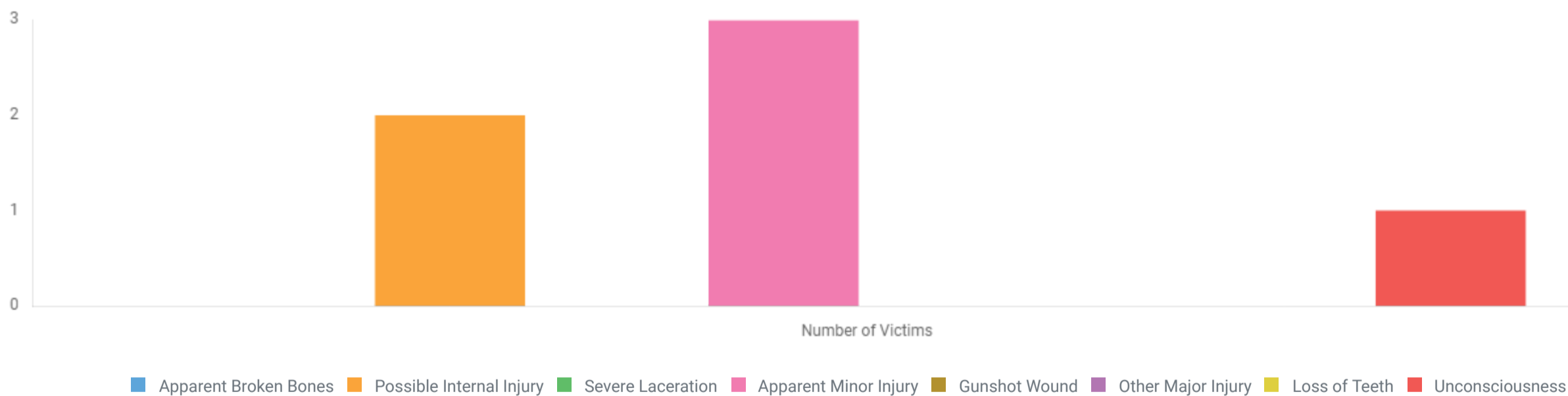

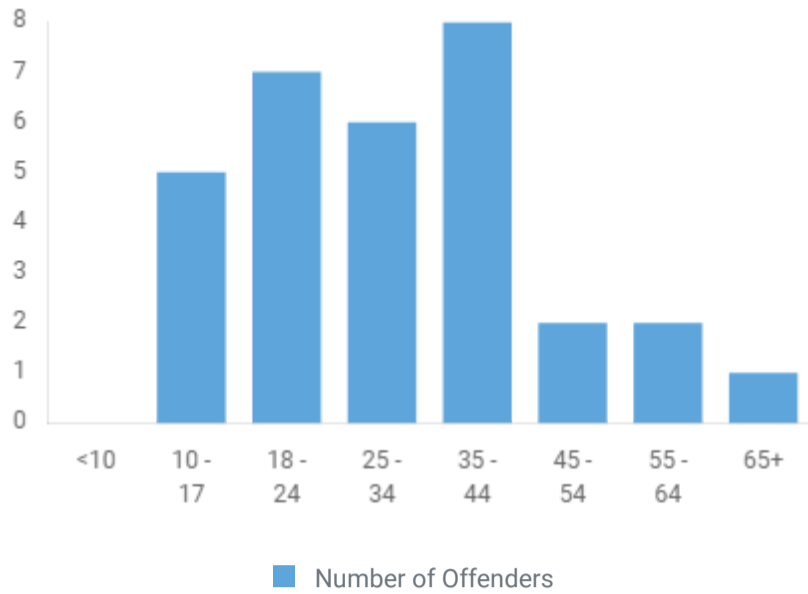

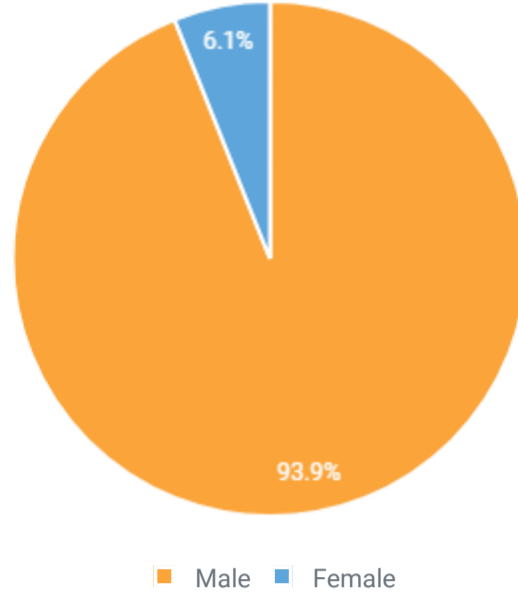

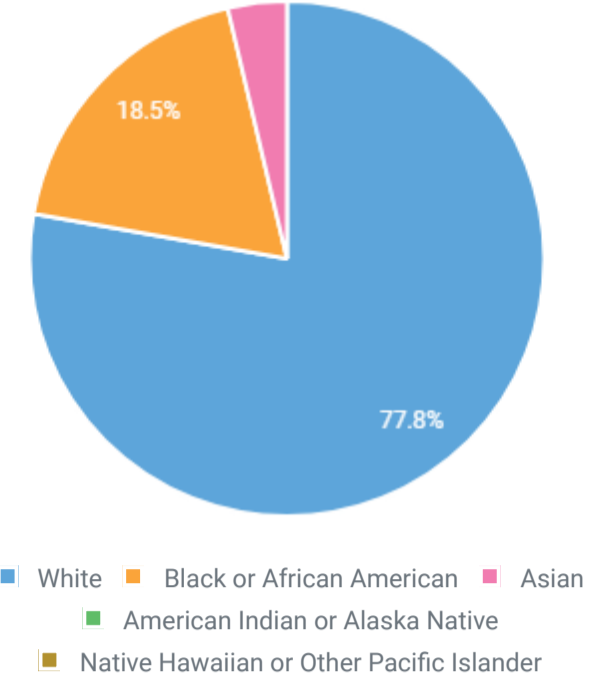

ROBBERY

The taking of anything of value from the control, custody, or care of another person by force or threat of force and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

Crimes: 4 Clearance Rate: 50%

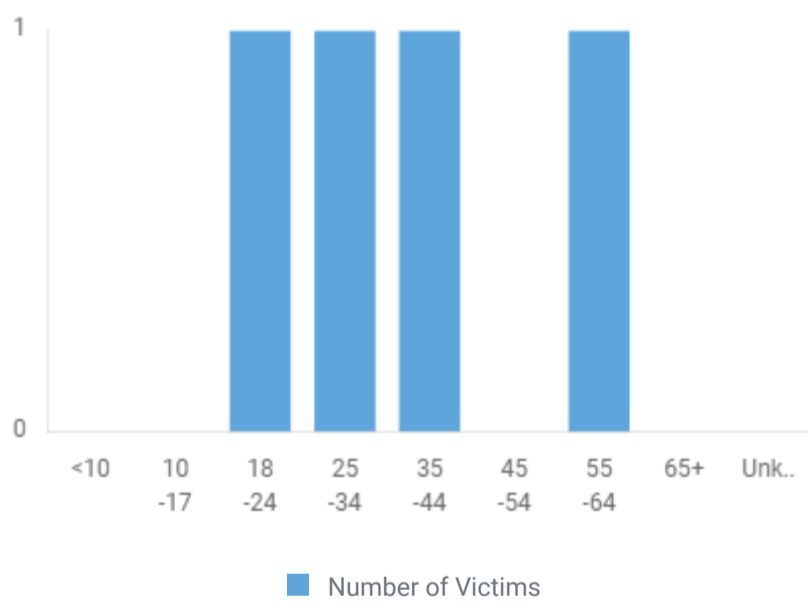

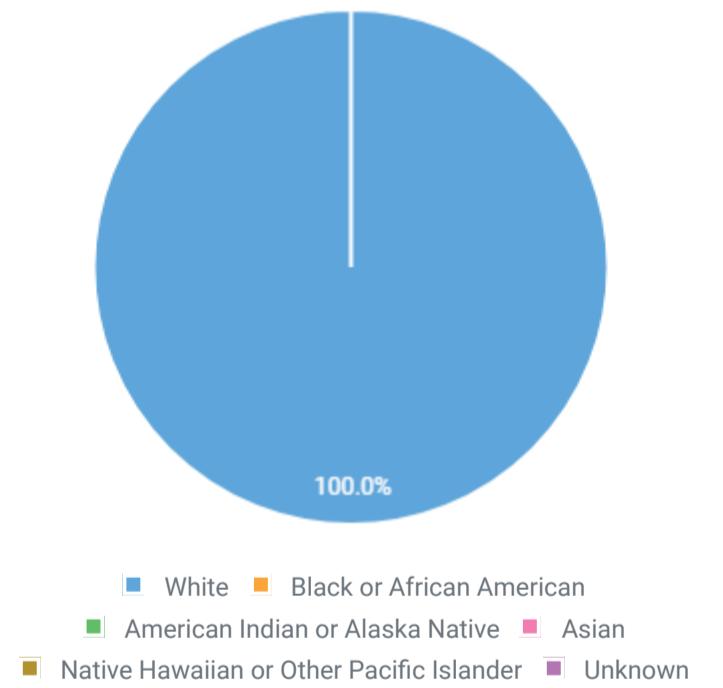

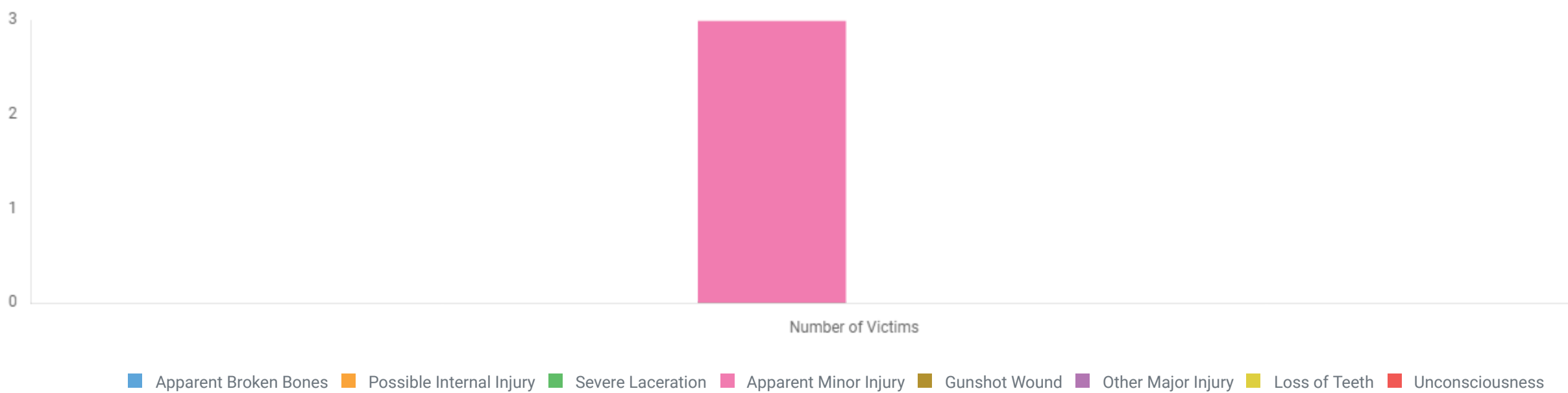

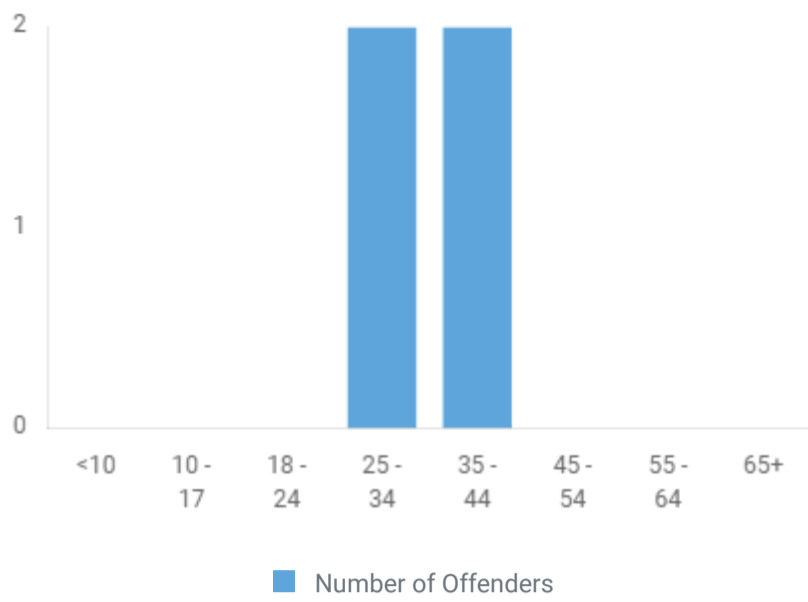

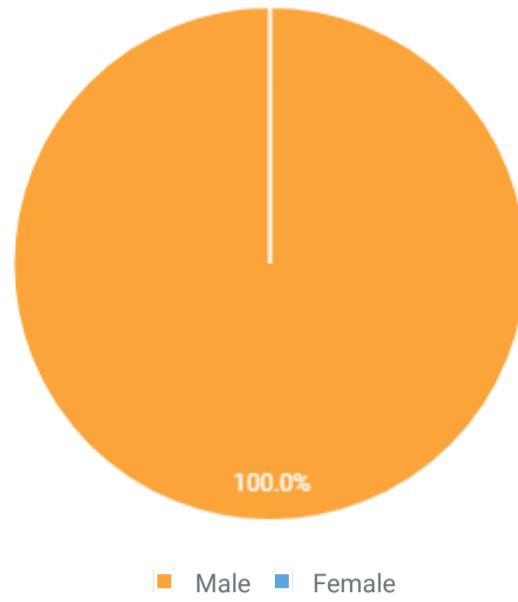

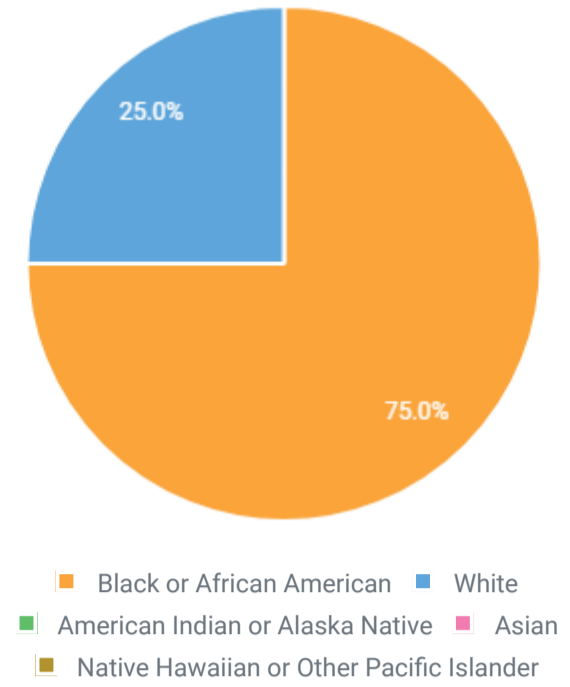

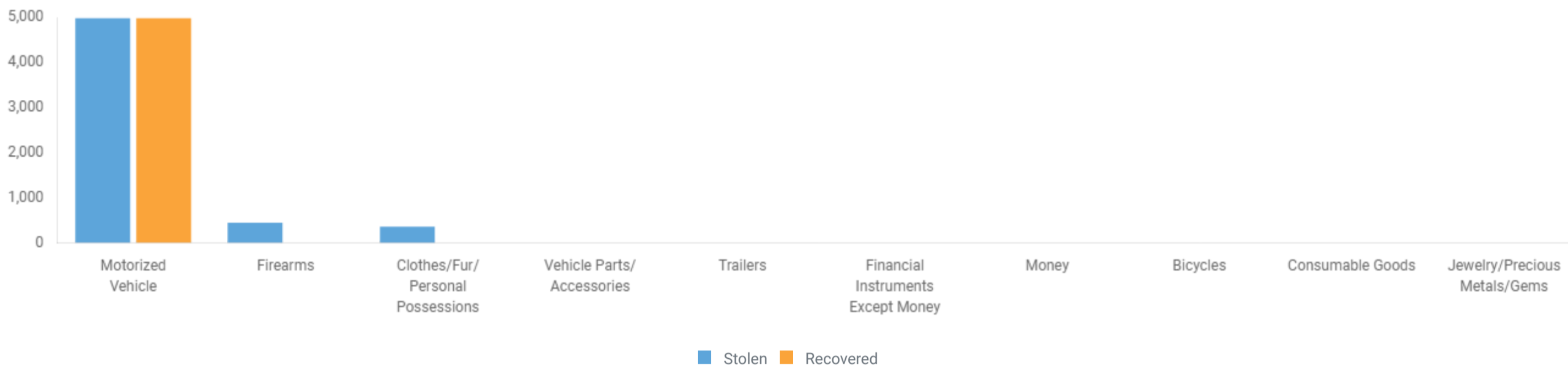

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT



An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a dangerous weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury, or where there was a risk for serious injury/intent to seriously injure.

Crimes: 31 **Clearance Rate:** 74.19%

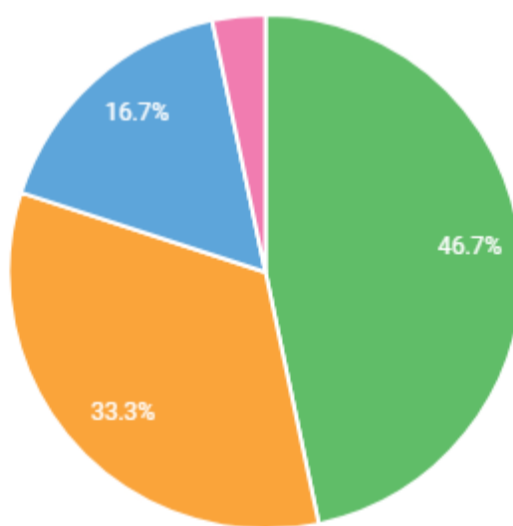

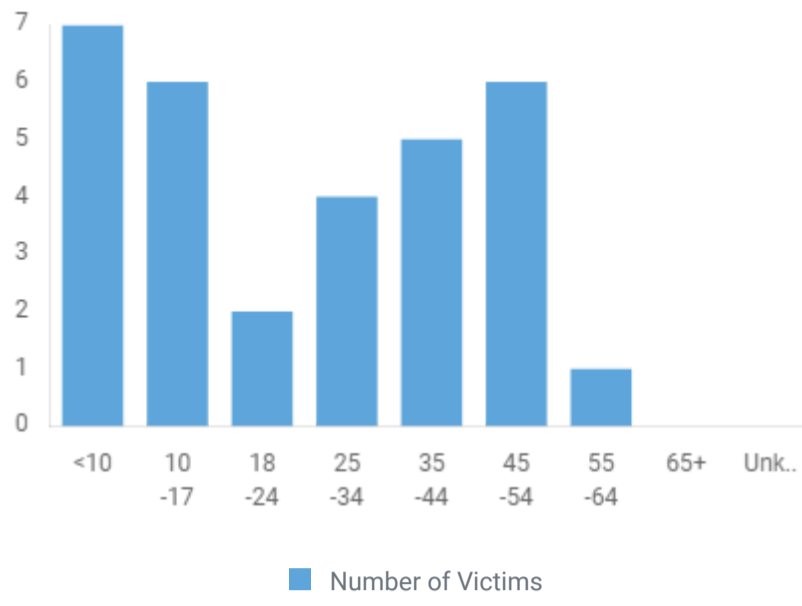

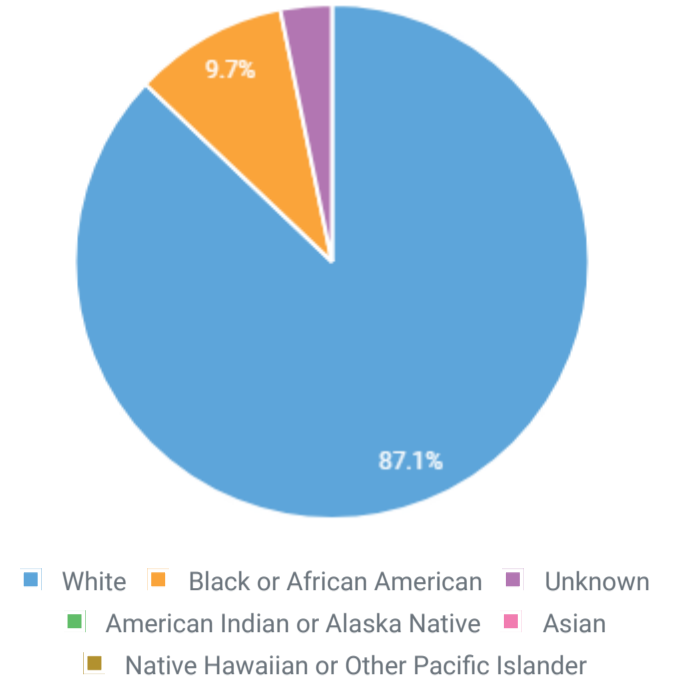

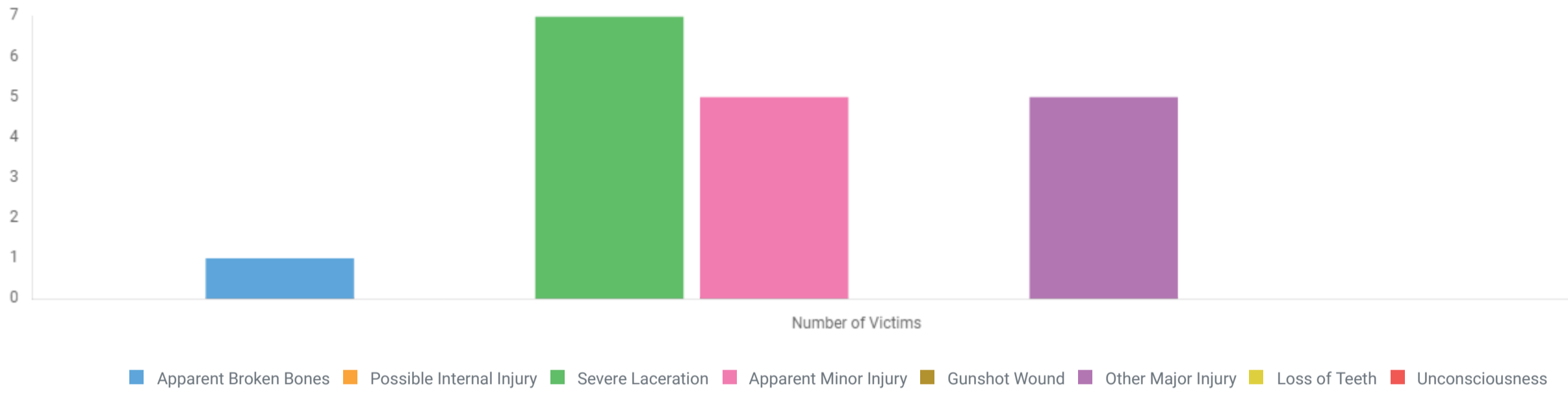

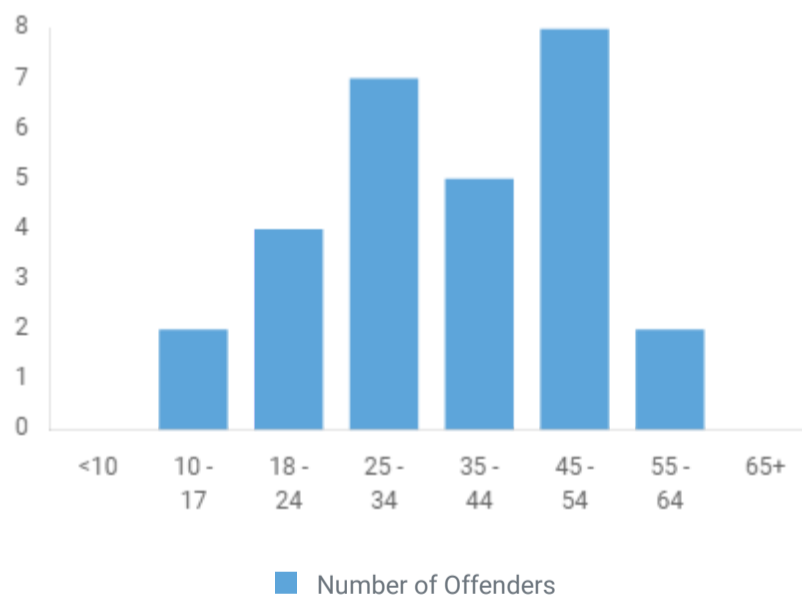

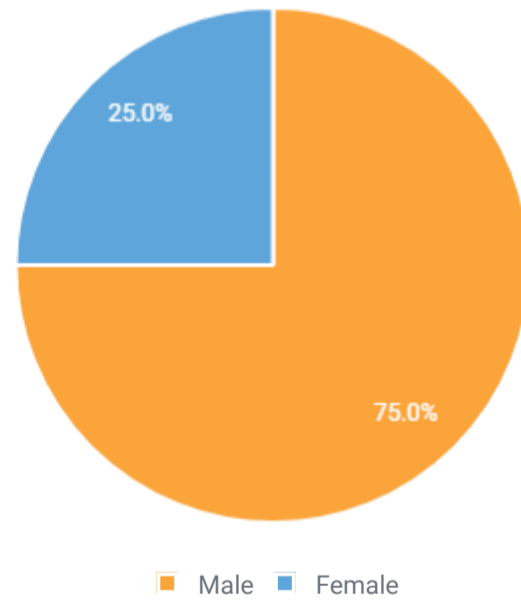

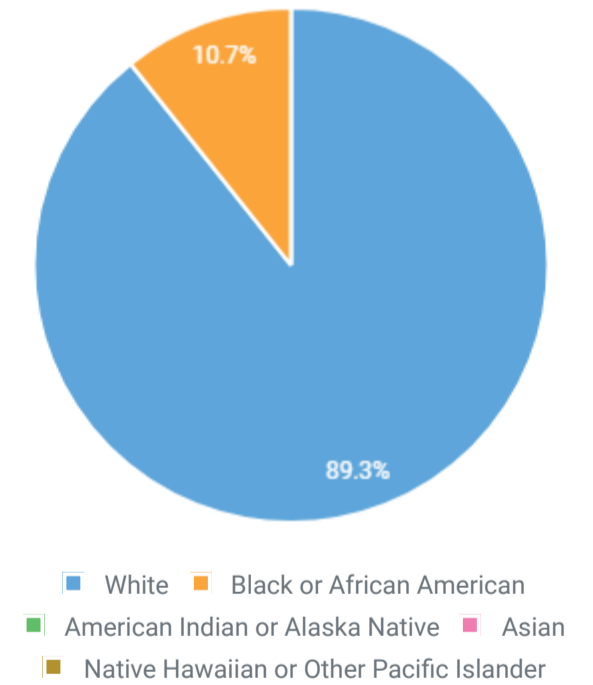

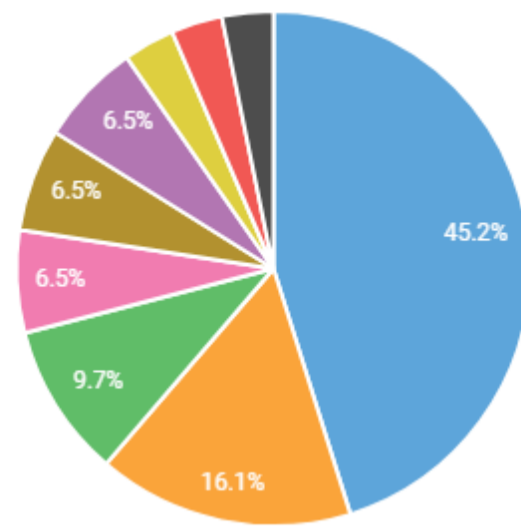

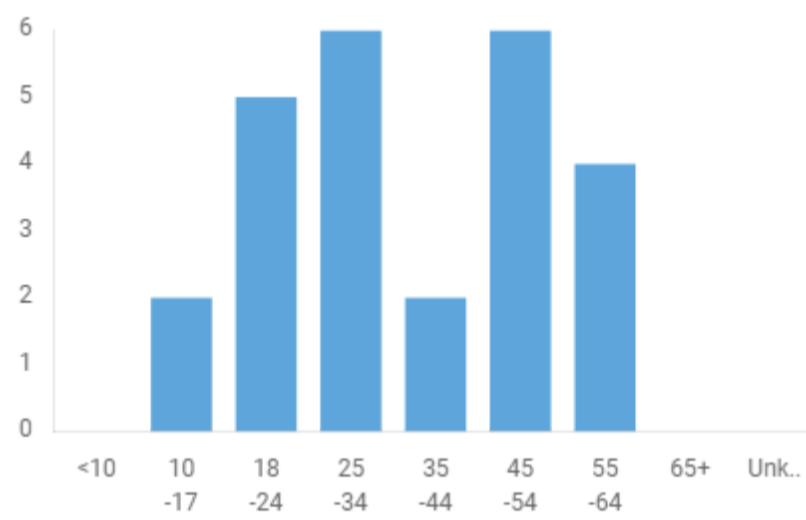

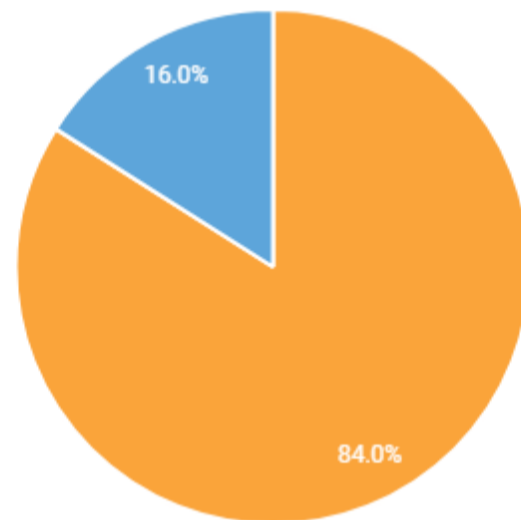

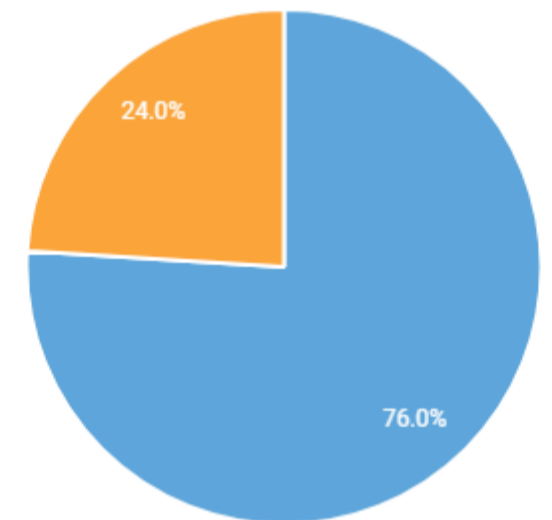
